formed by former residents of the Sovi-et Union. • Herman was born in Detroit and weat to Russia in 1931 with 300 other American families when he was 16. They went to the USSR to build a Ford Motor plant in Nizhni-Novgorod, now called Gorky. Among the Americans there were Victor and Walter Reuther. Herman became a pilot, and in 1935, at age 20, broke the world record for free fall parachute jumping. At 22 he fought in the Spanish Civil War in the Lincoln Brigade of American volunteers.

When he attempted to return to the U.S. in 1938, Herman was arrested dur-ing the Stallinist purges. Without a trial or charges he knew about he served 18 years in prisons, labor camps and Si-berian exile. He was pardoned in 1956.

He earned a Ph.D. degree and be-came a professor of English in Kishi-nev. He also won many awards and medals for athletics, teaching and pub-lished eight books and a film in the USSR.

In 1976 he returned to the U. S. and has since been able to bring his wife, her mother and their two daughters here as well. His autobiography, called "Coming out of the Ice" was just published by Harcourt, Brance and Company.
