Detroit has been officially ruled out as site of the National Bowling Museum and the Hall of Fame. The selection committee was in Detroit recently looking over the city's offered sites. The committee was shown two locations. The first was on Michigan Avenue at Third in downtown Detroit and

the other was the State Fair Grounds. The committee didn't seem impressed with either and the fact that none of the top Detroit officials were on hand didn't help. The choice now seems to be between Akron, Ohio and Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

THE HEAVIEST assault on the pins

this season was made last Friday night in the Little Caesar Classic at Westland Bowl when five of the sharpshooters broke the 700 barrier.

Bob Golke Jr. paced the assault with games of 279, 248 and 230 for 757. Next came Jim Beck with counts of 243, 258 and 236 for a 737.

Larry Sager linked counts of 235, 255 and 246 for 736. Next came Bob Shonce, who rolled games of 199, 268 and 255 for 722. And Mike Leto, who posted games of 248, 234 and 235 for 717.

It was the highest scoring night in the history of the classic. While the

men were stealing the show, Pam Anderson paced the women with games of 205 and 211 in 607.

THREE OTHER barrier breaking scores were registered during the week.

As usual, John Hurley, bowling in the morning league at Westland, added another to his string that now has reached 13 this season. He had games of 212, 252 and 279 for 743. In his third game, he had nine strikes in a row and then left up the No. 4 pin.

Dave Shiffman joined the 700 club ranks when he linked counts of 260, 246 and 196 for 702 in the Bel-Aire Classic and Joe Tonaski went one pin over the coveted mark with games of 243, 194 and 264 for 701 in the Super Bowl classic.

THE GOEBEL and First Federal teams in the Thursday All-Star classic

turned in one of the oddities of the season last week when they were tied at the end of the second game with 2,108 and then bowled a 1,006 final to tie the series at 3,114.

MENTIONING THE GOEBEL team, it now has passed its goal of \$20,000 in the leader dog exhibition series. With three more exhibitions scheduled, it is certain that the fund will go far beyond any pre-season predictions.

It is hoped now that the fund will reach the point where six dogs, each costing about \$4,000, will be available for the blind.

FOR THE FIRST time in several years, an individual bowler scored a slam in the Livonia Ladies Classic.

Joan Lewis did it when she won the first game with 201-22-229, took the second with 200-28-228 and the third with 189-28-217. This enabled her to take the series with 590-84-674.

## Area caddies receive scholarships

Two area caddies, Southfield's David Banda and Farmington Hills' Michael Yorick, were among 30 young Michigan caddies to receive Chick Evans college scholarships recently.

Banda, 17, is a senior at Birmingham Groves High School. He caddied at the Birmingham Country Club. The 17-year-old Yorick, a senior at Farmington Harrison, caddied at Franklin Hills Country Club. Both will attend the University of Michigan.

The awards, part of the national Evans Scholars program sponsored by the Western Golf Association, were announced by F. Geoffrey Welsch, president of the Golf Association of Michigan.

Sixteen of the new Evans Scholars will be enrolled at the University of

Michigan, and 14 will attend Michigan State University. Each grant covers full tuition and housing, renewable for four years at an estimated value of \$8,000.

Famed amateur golfer Charles "Chick" Evans originated the Evans Scholars Foundation in 1930. Today there are more than 800 Scholars attending college. Some 235 new award winners will be announced on a national basis this winter.

The scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis considering caddie record, academic standing in the upper 25 per cent of the high school class, and the need for financial aid.

Approximately 130 GAM-sponsored Evans Scholars will be enrolled next fall at Michigan State and Michigan,

where they live in Chapter houses managed and maintained by Scholars themselves.

Support for the Foundation comes from the contributions of more than 90,000 golfers, including more than 15,000 in Michigan. It is the largest individually financed scholarship operation in the country.

The list of 30 awardees includes five young women.
