The outcome of the 13th annual Garden City West Novice Tournament, which was contested last weekend, could be a good indication of why Westland John Glenn is a perennial wrestling power.

The young Rockets bested the 28-team field with 188 1/2 points, only five more than runner-up Farmington.

Temperance-Bedford placed third, Plymouth Salem fourth and North Farmington fifth.

Glenn's first-place showing brought into focus the ability of the coaching staff to find replacement wrestlers and polish their talents to keep the varsity one of the best in the area year in and year out.

The tournament was limited to novice (beginning) grapplers, those in their first year of competition. Three hundred fifty-eight wrestlers took part and 84 won medals.

His latest triumph came in the Mas-

ters when he averaged 240 to conquer John Bennett in the finals, 960-892. He put together games of 202, 224, 268 and 266 for his victory.

Bennett was not without honor—even in defeat. On his way to the finals at Belmar Lanes, he rolled the fourth highest four game series in the nation when he found the range for counts of 209, 279, 267 and 278 and a 1093 series.

SCORING REACHED a new high throughout the western suburbs during the week as eight series above the magic 700 were posted.

Heading the list, as usual was John Hurley, in the morning league at Westland Bowl who came through with his 14th 700 of the season. This time he linked games of 205, 256, and 288 for 749. A few lanes away Don Hale had counts of 256, 225 and 228 for 709.

THE LITTLE CAESAR CLASSIC also figured in the heavy play on the pins with three counts that broke the 700 barrier.


