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# Victories come hard for Harrison cagers

This hasn't been a banner year for Farmington Harrison's basketball team.

The Hawks got off to a slow start

and will probably finish well out of the Western Six cage title chase. But the winter won't be a total washout: Harrison whipped Livonia Churchill, 45-42, in a WSL thriller last Friday for its third-straight victory.

Harrison's win, its fifth against nine losses this season, was a matter of balanced scoring and a couple of timely plays by guard Tom Cundy, who didn't even figure in the scoring.

With 38 seconds left to play and the Hawks nursing a one-point lead, Cundy found teammate Brian Burgess under the basket for an easy layup. Churchill missed a shot a few seconds later, and Cundy came up with the rebound.

Harrison then dribbled out the clock, and went to the locker room with the victory.

Burgess and Scott Hendries each finished with 10 points, and Brad Herremans had 11 to provide the balance for Harrison. John Tremonti added eight points and helped out in other ways.

"John really did the job for us," said Harrison coach Mike Teachman. "He's only six feet tall, but he got 10 rebounds and had three assists. He really hustled the whole game."

Dave Krick scored 12 points for Churchill, which trailed by two points (27-25) at halftime. Churchill fell to 4-4 overall with the loss. Both teams have 2-4 league records.

Harrison plays Friday at home against Plymouth Canton. Game time is 8 p.m.

## N. FARMINGTON 65 GARDEN CITY EAST 54

North Farmington, with 6-8 Mark Biehl scoring 14 points and grabbing eight rebounds, bombed Garden City East, 55-54, in a Northwest Suburban League contest last Friday on the East court.

North upped its overall record to 9-3 and its NSL mark to 3-3 with the victory. East dropped to 1-12 overall and 1-5 in the league.

The teams were tied at 23-21 at halftime, but North blew away the Panthers with a 22-12 scoring margin in the third quarter. Brian Bowditch and Mike Howley scored 11 and 10 points, respectively, for North. Mike Kossick (18 points) and Tim Taylor (16) led East.

North travels to the Pontiac Silverdome for a nonleague game against city-rival Farmington High at 6:30 p.m. Thursday. On Friday, North entertains Redford Thurston at 8 p.m.

## LAKELAND 60 FARMINGTON 45

Farmington lost. Sound familiar?

It happened for the 10th time this season Friday as Milford Lakeland clobbered the Falcons, 60-45, in an Inter Lakes League game. Farmington is 3-10 overall and 1-5 in the ILL.

Gary Gleeson, a 6-3 junior, poured in 22 points to lead the winners. Jeff DeYoung, a 6-3 forward who transferred to Lakeland from Covert in western Michigan, added 16 points.

Jerry Krist scored 16 points for Farmington, and teammate John Dunn had 10. Farmington hurt its cause with 22 turnovers.

"Our shot selection was terrible," said Falcon coach Rich Roy. "We made nine of 23 in the first half, and the second half wasn't much better. And we shot only eight free throws. That shows you how aggressive we were."

Following its game with North in the Silverdome, Farmington returns to ILL play on Friday at Pontiac Northern.

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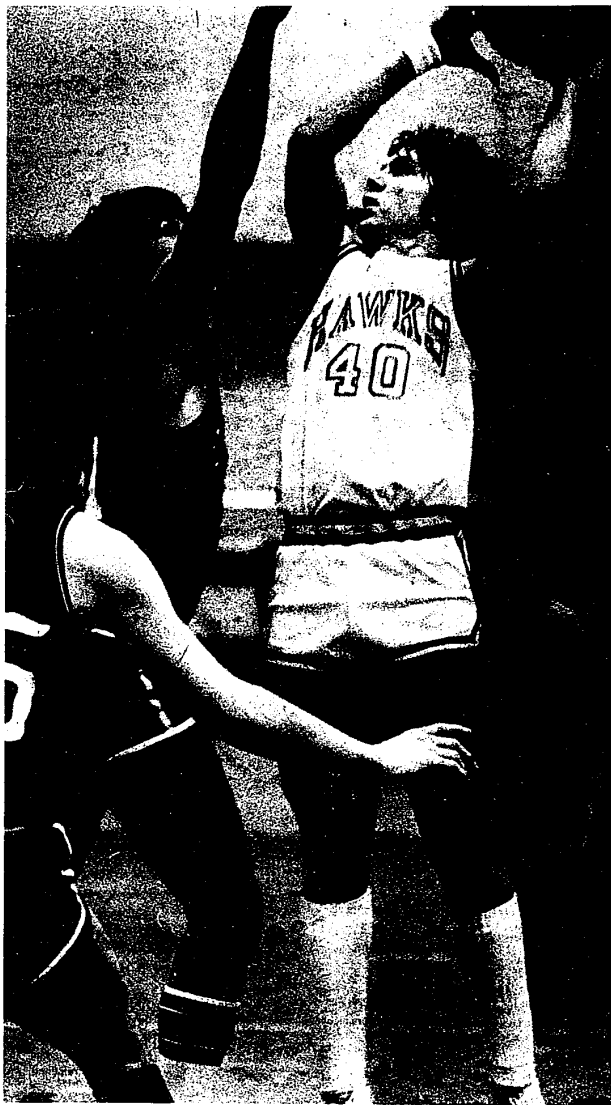
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Harrison's Dave Turnquist snares a rebound against Churchill during Friday's contest. (Photo by Allen Schlossberg)

# Raiders, Falcons win; HHS tankers sink again

North Farmington, with Keith Whetter and Kirk Knock each winning two individual events, defeated Redford Union, 107-65, last Thursday in a Northwest Suburban League swimming meet in Union's pool.

Wetter won the 50-yard freestyle (23.9) and the 100-yard freestyle (54.5). Knock finished first in the 100-yard butterfly (58.6) and the 100-yard backstroke (1:03.8).

North won three more events, including the 200 medley relay (Chp Lee, David Paul, Knock and

Scott Moore), which was timed in 1:53.9. Scott Whetter, Keith's brother, compiled 179.85 points to win the diving event, and teammate Jim Cassman won the 100 breaststroke in 1:07.6.

Coach Pat Duthie's North club has a 4-1 overall record and a 1-0 NSL mark.

In other swimming action last Thursday, Farmington High evened its overall record at 4-4 with a 104-68 win over non-league Walled Lake Western.

Farmington's Bob Caruthers won the individual events—the 100 free

(53.7) and the 100 backstroke (1:06.0)—and swam on the 200 medley relay (with Dave Tupper, Dave Poulos and Dave Uzelac), which won with a time of 1:51.0. Uzelac won the 50 free (23.6), Poulos won the 100 butterfly (1:02.0) and Dennis Anshin won the diving event (201.40 points).

**EARLIER LAST WEEK, FARMINGTON** defeated Walled Lake Central, 106-66, in an Inter Lakes League meet. Mark Wubbena won the 500 free in 5:39.8, and Anshin won the diving competition with 218.40 points.

Northville High, the class of the Western Six League, downed Farmington Harrison, 46-33, last Thursday. Harrison is winless. Six starts this season.

Harrison won seven of the 11 events, but Northville had the superior depth. Harrison's Al Laforet won two events, the 200 free (1:55.4) and the 500 free (5:16.1), and teammate John Rudel took the 200 individual medley (2:10.5) and the 100 free (52.1).

Other Harrison firsts: the 400 free relay (Laforet, Linus Glyvidis, Al Babcock and Rudel), 3:49.1; Babcock (1:04.3 in

the 100 backstroke), and Doug Anderson (1:50.45 in diving).

Earlier, Rudel, a junior, established a school and pool record in 4:58.28 in Harrison's 107-50 loss to Walled Lake Western. Rudel also won the 200 free (1:51.0), and Babcock took the 100 free (56.9) and the 100 back (1:05.3).

Harrison swims at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday at home against non-league West Bloomfield. On Thursday, Harrison entertains Plymouth Canton, North Farmington hosts Livonia Franklin, and Farmington travels to Pontiac Northern.
