Dr. Harry Denman, a layman who led the evangelistic program of the Methodist Church for 27 years, will be evangelist in the Clarenceville United Methodist Church during the week of Nov. 9 to 14. Services are set at 9 and 11:15 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. Sunday and at 7:30 p.m. the rest of the week. The program is open to the public.

After serving as the general secretary of the Board of Evangelism for the Methodist Church, Dr. Denman retired in 1965 with these words: "I retire today and begin a new life tomorrow. In this new life I will be a layman trying to help churches and persons in their evangelistic work."

He has held evangelistic missions in South America, Cuba, India, Korea, the Philippines,

Scandinavia, Africa, Malaysia, Pakistan and elsewhere.

Plymouth Presbyterian Plans Sandburg Program

Almost a century of poetry, songs and stories in the life of one of America's greatest literary figures will be heard when the Alpha-Omega Players present "The World of Carl Sandburg" at 8:30 p.m. on Nov. 4 at The First United Presbyterian Church of Plymouth, 701 Church.

Sandburg, a one-time hobo, milkman, soldier, waiter, laborer, wheat picker, bricklayer, horse publisher and newspaperman, has gone on posterity his earthy observations which encompass his 89 years of living and for which he won two Pulitzer Prizes.

When Sandburg first began to write his poems and songs in the new free verse style, one publisher told him that they would never see print. They were, he said, the work of a young upstart.

But he persisted and became the most widely read and admired poet, not only in the United States but also in a score of other countries.

The Alpha-Omega Players are the nation's most active repertory theater group. Last year they presented over 300 stagings of "The World of Carl Sandburg" to 45 states.

A number of current church documents will be sealed into the new cornerstone, together with the contents of cornerstones in the building presently being used.

These documents were placed in the old cornerstones in 1950.
