CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS Summary of Proceedings City Council Meeting January 15, 1979

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills met in Special Session at City Hall on January 15, 1979. Mayor Oppertbauer convened the meeting at 7:30 P.M. Council Members present were: Deacon, Dolan, and Soronen. Members Alkateeb, Smith, and Jones were late. Others present were: Acting City Manager Cairns, Deputy City Clerk Thomas and City Attorney Libeau.

After Public Hearing, necessity was established and cost in the amount of \$36,204 for road improvement on Quail Hollow was unanimously approved.

After Public Hearing, a request to vacate an alley between Firwood and Ravine just east of Orchard Lake Road contingent upon settlement of a consent judgment was approved by a vote of 4 to 3. Alkateeb, Dolan, and Smith opposed.

After Public Hearing, a request to vacate an alley between Middlebelt and Tulare Streets was unanimously approved.

After Public Hearing, Amending Ordinance No. C26-175, a request to rezone property located on the north side of Northwestern Highway just west of Middlebelt Road from Single Family Residential (R-1) use to Office Service District (OS-1) use was unanimously approved.

Agreement with Villan-Leman & Associates, Inc. for planning consultant services was unanimously approved.

Participation agreement with Oakland County Road Commission to install deceleration and passing lanes on Middlebelt Road at Granary and Glenview Roads was approved.

Waiver of City Engineering Standards regarding "Public Road Access" for the 12 Mile Investment Company located on the south side of 12 Mile Road just west of Farmington Road was unanimously approved.

Request to pursue the changing of the spelling of "Helstead" to "Halsstad" on City, County, and State signs was granted.

Command Officer's employment contract was unanimously confirmed.

Appointment of Lawrence C. Savage as City Manager was unanimously confirmed.

Motion to hold an executive session regarding a personnel matter was unanimously confirmed.

Meeting adjourned at 11:16 P.M.
