

Farmington abounds with big memories

involved in the changing times, too.

In the '50s, teachers tend to remember students as quiet, conservative and posing fewer discipline problems.

The children of the '60s leave a different memory in the minds of teachers at Farmington High School.

"The Sixties were a bit hard to handle. The kids were quite disillusioned. There was antipathy between high school and college students and their parents," Harrison said.

"We didn't have that kind of problem

in 1945-56. In the years following World War II, the young people were anxious to get an education and get on with it. There was a restless period after the Korean War," he said.

But that restlessness of the '60s has been receding into a return to conservatism, according to Shewbridge.

"In the '60s there was a period of radical protest. Things were quite different. Student rights were banded about. There's been a gradual return to conservatism," he said.

"Students tend to be personally responsible and to be more future-oriented," he added.

In April, the chorale will appear again with Antal Dorati and the Detroit Symphony, performing another Strauss opera, "Helen." The dates for these shows are April 25 and 27 in Ford Auditorium.

The spring season will conclude with a concert for Congregation Beth Abraham, Hillside, on West Bloomfield at 8 p.m., Tuesday, June 5.

But beyond the surface resemblance, there are some differences in the 20 years between Eisenhower's and Carter's America.

Marriages between high school students after graduation have tapered off. Economic and educational reasons force students into putting off married life for several years.

"There's more of an attitude that you see life before you settle down," Shewbridge commented.

But for some students, Farmington High School made an impression that colored their adult lives.

In 1959, a student wrote in then-assistant principal Harold Humble's year book, "Keep 'em in line and I'll be back in a few years and help."

In 1975, the same student, Jack Lawing, now sporting a beard but still smiling, was seen again in the Farmington High School yearbook. This time he was listed with the rest of the administrative staff. Today he is director of services for the Farmington School District.

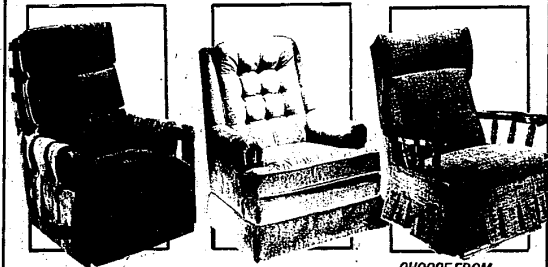

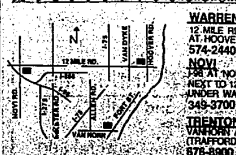
