As the bowlers head in to the tournament season, Rose Marsh, whose job as secretary of the Detroit Women's Bowling Association is to oversee the big event that opens at Ark Lanes West on Feb. 24, is puzzled.

The official team entry was closed at 975 teams which is a few teams below last year's total. The minor events have soared and Rose readily admits that she doesn't know why.

Elaborate ceremonies are planned for the opening and all of the top offi-

cials of both men's and women's associations will be on hand when the first ball is thrown at 1:30 p.m.

CORA FIEBIG, who is making a strong bid to become the area top average bowler, strengthened her claim to top honors Sunday at Ark Lanes West when she won the monthly mid-city women's event and averaged 213 in her final four games.

She bowled well through the entire program but reached the peak in the

final where she beat Ruby Williamson by a mere 10 pins.

HIGH SCORING returned to Westland Bowl when two of the sharpshooters in the Little Caesar Classic broke the 700 barrier.

Bob Basocchi did the greatest shooting when he linked games of 225, 285 and 233 for 744. At that figure he beat Dave Pickett by 24 pins.

After posting games of 255 and 243, Dave dropped to 222 in his last game

and that beat him. Third place went to Dave Kaliszewski with a 691.

Marge Kropacek failed to reach double-century figures but she didn't have to as her 557 was good enough to earn the pacesetter role.

PAT LISOWSKI returned to the winner's circle in the Classic at Garden Lanes when her 626 count last Friday earned her the top place. Mazie Kowalski was next in line but she was 40 pins back. In the Missifits league Don Gavin Jr. was tops with an even 600.

THREE MORE MEMBERS were admitted to the split conversion club at Mayflower Lanes. Pat Skyner qualified by topping the 6-7 and Lou Ann Snider swept the 7-8-10 to gain membership. Ronnie Kranek knocked over the 4-5-10.

IN OTHER good performances, Tim Smith paced the mixed Classic at Farmington Lanes with a 222 in 627 and Bruce Lawson, bowling in the senior citizens traveling league at Country Lanes had a 670 on games of 224, 233 and 213.

Gals' gymnastics meet planned for Ferndale

The Acronauts Parents Club of Bloomfield Hills will host the second Durbin Invitational gymnastics meet, Feb. 17-18, at Ferndale High School.

The meet is sponsored by the Durbin Company real estate firm. Proceeds will go toward paying the team's travel expenses and judging fees.

OCC routs foe, 110-101

Kurt James and Johnny Keel combined for 56 points to lead Oakland Community College to a 110-101 victory over Highland Park Community College on Saturday.

The win raised OCC's Eastern Conference record to 14-2. The Raiders trail league leader Schoolcraft by 42 percentage points. The Ocelots have a 13-2 mark and have three league contests remaining.

Saturday's game against Highland Park was a foul-filled affair, with Highland Park being whittled for 31 personals and OCC drawing 23. But Keel and James provided the one-two punch that carried the Raiders to the win.

OCC raced to a 57-40 first half lead, as Keel pumped in 22 of his game-high 29 points. After the intermission, it was James' turn. The 6-foot-7 center netted 19 of his 27 points in the final 20 minutes to keep OCC in front.

James also collected 14 rebounds in the game, while Walker D. Russell had another great game, scoring 16 points and passing off for 12 assists. Darryl Herring also scored in double figures for the Raiders, as he hit for 15. Clayton McDowell led Highland Park with 21.

OCC plays its final regular season game Saturday against Washtenaw. Then the Raiders move on to the Region 12 Junior College tournament at Delta College near Bay City. Twenty-six teams will participate in the tourney, with OCC's first contest against Lake Michigan Community College on Tuesday, Feb. 27. Teams from Ohio and Indiana, as well as Michigan, will compete.

The winner will advance to the national championships.
