County GOP brass ease into new terms

There was little change among Oakland County Republican leaders last weekend.

Like Republicans throughout the state, Oakland's delegates to the state convention met in caucus at Detroit's Renaissance Center and elected district leaders and delegates to the Republican State Central Committee.

19th DISTRICT

Art Saltzman of Franklin was reelected chairman of the 19th Congressional District, which includes Birmingham, Bloomfield Township, Bloomfield Hills, Beverly Hills, Orchard Lake, West Bloomfield and most of western and northern Oakland County.

Other district officers are vice-chairman JoAnn VanTassel of Lake Orion, secretary Susan Allen of Birmingham and treasurer Roy Sjoberg of West Bloomfield.

Elected to the district committee were: Susan Eliertsen, R. Stephen Ottewill, Marylu Bennetham, Richard Sanderson, and James Grathwahl — all from Birmingham; Eleanor Blum and Marilyn Fessler of West Bloomfield Township; and Heather Hill and G.W. Casdell of Walled Lake.

Also elected to the district committee were Judith Cox of Ortonville, James Conlen of Oxford, Larry Leidlein of Lake Orion, L. Catherine Walters of Pontiac and Bert Beumann of Brighton.

Four persons were elected to the state committee: Ellen Templin, Nancy McConnell and Alan May, all of Bloomfield Hills, as well as Mike Hagarty of Brighton.

Ray Saltzman of Franklin was elected to the state issues committee and Edward L. Haan of Brighton will be the alternate to that committee.

18th DISTRICT

Larry Littman of Troy was reelected chairman of the 18th Congressional District, which includes Troy, Clawson, Royal Oak and the southeastern portion of Oakland County and a part of Macomb County.

Other district officers are: Vice-chairwomen, Dorothy McIntosh of Ferndale and Marcia Herbst of Sterling Heights; secretary, Lynn Spencely of Royal Oak; and treasurer, Tom Weidman of Royal Oak.

Milton Randolph of Berkley was elected to the state issues committee and Bettie Swida of Royal Oak will be the alternate to that committee.

12th DISTRICT

Len Stoker of Mount Clemens was elected chairman of the 12th Congressional District, which includes the City of Rochester, half of Avon Township and portions of Macomb, St. Clair and Sanilac Counties.

Other district officers are Vice-chairman Elizabeth Eldridge, Secretary Colette Guerin and Treasurer C.J. Nodus — all of Mount Clemens.

Only one Oakland County resident, James C. Hill of Rochester, was elected to any district office. Hill was voted a seat on the district committee.

Label speeds tax returns

Taxpayers can help speed up the processing of their federal income tax return and receive their refund much faster by using the pre-addressed, peel-off label on their return, the Internal Revenue Service said.

The label, which is located on the cover of the tax return package, lists the taxpayer's name, address, and So-

cial Security number. If any of the information is incorrect, the taxpayer should make needed changes directly on the label.

Married taxpayers filing joint returns should be sure that both social security numbers appear on the label. If only one spouse's number is shown, the other number should be written on the label.
