

## Those hurt by loss invited to seminar

Three evenings in March will be devoted to "Significant Loss" seminar in Juliette Center at St. Agatha Parish, on Beech-Daly, south of Eight Mile, in Redford Township.

"Loss is a small word which encompasses a large hurt," said Ruth Miceli. "Obvious losses, the death of a loved one, separation, divorce, and not-so-obvious losses, such as moving, aging, retirement, illness, are often times shattering. But there are things which can be done to help."

Three sessions will begin at 7:30 p.m. on March 4, 11, and 18, allowing participants

to question a psychologist, a resource person, and a hospital chaplain about their own losses or those persons close to the participants.

A bonus, scheduled for March 25, will be a recap of the entire seminar and general discussion.

There will be refreshments and hand-outs for particular needs.
