Police find body

A memorial service was held Friday at St. Vincent dePaul Church in Pontiac for James Neil Brooks, 46, of Farmington Hills. Three Westland boys discovered his body last Tuesday afternoon in Edward Hines Park.

A Wayne County Medical Examiner's report said Brooks, of 29026 Farmington Road, died of a self-inflicted wound to the chest. He was found lying under a tree about a half-mile west of

Middlebelt and 100 yards south of Edward Hines Drive.

"From all indications at the scene, it was a suicide," said Wayne County Sheriff Department Det. Richard Fenton.

Fenton said investigation showed that the weapon, a single-shot, 12-gauge shotgun found with the body, had been purchased shortly before. Found were receipts for shotgun and shells.

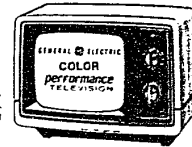
