## **Bloomfield Surf wins another title**

# Farmington Glen swims to 3rd in NSSL meet

Few things in life are as predictable as the outcome of the Northwest Subur-ban Swim League's championship

meet.

Bloomfield Surf Club scored 652
team points to dominate its third
straight NSSL championship meet last
weekend at Beech Woods Park in

"We had good depth this year and that's what won it for us," sald Lane, who finished his 12th year as Surf's coach. "We were prettyl deep in the 15-17-year-old boys, and most all of our girls were good.

"We have some super kids at Surf,"

said Lane, who coaches boys' swimming at Bloomfield Hills Andover. 'Coming down here is a nice transition from the high-school. These kids are a close-knit unit, and that's surprising because of the age difference. But the older kids take good care of the younger ones."

The NSSL holds competition for more than 1,000 swimmers from 16 private clubs in the northwest suburbs, but somehow Bloomfield Surf tankers

always seem to end up on top of the standings.

THE TEAM'S success — 24 straight dual meet victories going back three seasons including, a 10-0 record this summer — is due to talent and hard work, according to Lane. 
