Classic play continues run

The Greenfield Village Players offer a light look at high society in the classic play "The Philadelphia Story" — the story of how a young reporter and photographer become involved in a wacky wedding of a socialite — on Fridays and Saturdays through Sept. 8 at Henry Ford Museum Theater, in Dearborn.

In this play, once a smash hit starring Katherine Hepburn, a spoiled daughter of the privileged classes of Philadelphia is set to embark on her second marriage when she finds herself increasingly interested in the fascinating reporter covering her wedding. At the end of the pre-wedding party,

she and the reporter take a dip in the pool and are met by the bridegroom upon their return.

All these prenuptial shenanigans put the wedding plans in doubt and take place against the background of the foibles of the "upper crust" of society — such as a romance between the socialite's father and a Broadway showgirl.

THE PERFORMANCE is at 8:30 p.m., and admission is \$3.50. Tickets can be purchased at the box office beginning one hour before the performance or at the entrance to Henry Ford Museum during regular hours.

Sylvia Sidney slated

The Detroit Film Society helps screen actress Sylvia Sidney celebrate her 50th year in films by bringing her to Detroit to appear, in person, at the opening program of the society's 1978-80 monthly film series at 7 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 8, at the main Detroit Public Library.

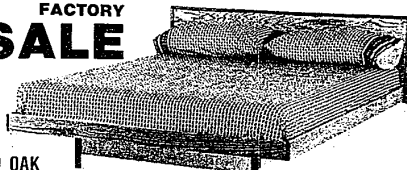
From September-June, the second weekend of each month will bring either a double-feature film program from Hollywood's "golden years" or an in-person appearance by someone closely associated with the film industry, introducing a single feature film.

Series tickets (\$20 for the 10 monthly programs) are available from the Friends of the Detroit Public Library's office at the Main Library; phone 833-4048 and an order form will be mailed. All screenings are held in the library's Friends Auditorium.

On Sept. 8, Sylvia Sidney will introduce her favorite film made during the 1930s, "You Only Live Once," with her frequent co-star, Henry Fonda. Fritz Lang directed this 1937 release in which the actress appears as a heartbreaking young girl in desperate flight from the law, one of a series of roles in which she portrayed a heroine who was underprivileged, poverty-stricken, but beautiful. She lived in city slums in "Street Scene" and "Dead End," a mountain shack in "Trail of the Lonesome Pine," she was mixed up in the rackets in "City Streets" and was a pregnant factory worker in "An American Tragedy."

Looking back on her half-century in films, her major disappointments are that she didn't get more roles which used her comedy gifts, and that she lost the role of Cathy in "Wuthering Heights" to Merle Oberon.
