Last year the foundation received \$114,069 from Torch Drive Funds.

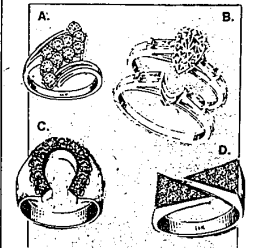
