Falcons' Big Moment... Face Arch Rival Saturday

It hasn't been a winning year in football at Farmington High School. One victory in eight games... that's where the Falcons stand. But the Falcons will realize that something "big" still remains before the curtain falls on their 1969 sch. year Saturday afternoon.

That "big" is North Farmington in the annual battle of the Farmington district schools... a game that carries the same intense rivalry as Michigan vs. Michigan State... Garden City East vs. West... Redford Union vs. Thurston.

"WE'LL BE there," said Coach U. Wieser of the Falcons as he readies his forces for the clash with North Farmington.

"We have some scores to settle with them... and we think that we can make matters very interesting for North."

One thing is for sure... Farmington will send a mighty passing attack against North Farmington, an attack which features the throwing of Dan Stehke and the receiving of Randy Cleveland.

It was a Stehke to Cleveland pass for 40 yards that produced one of Farmington's two touchdowns in Friday night's 36-16 defeat at the hands of Southfield in a non-league.

Dan Babcock scooted over left tackle from the two for Farmington's other touchdown.

Chuck Petrillo was the star for Southfield as he personally scored twice and passed for another pair of touchdowns. A 90-yard kickoff return by John Solberg also helped Southfield emerge an easy winner.

Falcons Place 9th In State

Observer football teams lagged far behind in the annual state high school cross country championships at Ypsilanti Saturday.

Ann Arbor Huron won the Class A title with 120 points while Farmington was ninth with 255 and Redford Union 17th with 366.

There were actually two races in class A -- one for boys representing schools which had qualified their teams, the second for boys who had qualified on their own, but minus their other teammates.

In the team event, RU's Bill Kuhn was seventh in 10:15 as Doug Brown of Notre Dame High won in 9:57.7.

In the individual race, Livonia Stevenson's Doug Kurtis was fourth and Dan Anderson of Garden City West sixth.

Charlotte won the Class B title with 58 points while East Jackson repeated in Class C-D with 123 points.

Rocks Victors In Finale

The lark Plymouth's Rocks had in closing out their 1969 football season with a 28-0 victory over Walled Lake Central was personified by Guard Bob Clayton when the PHS co-captain moved into the backfield to score the only touchdown of his high school career.

Considered one of the best defensive linemen in the state, the stocky Plymouthite moved to yardback and scored from two yards out after the Rocks had built a 22-0 lead and were certain to even their season's record at 4-1.

Only the play before, Clayton had put the Rocks in scoring position with a stable aerial gainer on a "tackle eligible" play and it closed out seasons of ups-and-downs in which handful of key plays reduced Plymouth from an unexpected Suburban Six title contender to an also ran.

In LEAGUE COMPETITION the Rocks scored their only win over Belleville, the two finishing in a "play" doubleplay 1-1 as Trenton and Redford Union tied for the championship at 4-1.

Beasley's defending titlist wound up at 3-2, with Allen Park fourth at 2-3.

Clayton's partner as co-captain, Bob Thornhill, tallied two of the Rocks' touchdowns on the muddy Walled Lake field Friday. Ed Scott got the other as Plymouth dominated play throughout. Quarterback Jon Celisberg ran for one two-point conversion and passed to Dan Choop for another.

The rival Plymouth defense limited Walled Lake to five yards on the ground and in the air, the Lakers never mounting a serious scoring threat.

Trojans' Diversified Attack Too Much For Brighton

When it comes to diversified attacks, Clarenceville High has enjoyed one this fall in the football season which ends against Crestwood Friday night. The Trojans have boasted a potent one-two running punch in Bob Riddling and Rob Weller. To go along with Riddling and Weller, there has been the passing of Mike Duman, plus the receiving of Riddling and Chuck Kozlowski.

Add to the fact the Trojans are strong defensively and one has the reason they are in the process of wrapping up one of the most successful seasons in the school's history.

Going into the finale against Crestwood, Clarenceville flashes a record of five victories, two defeats and one tie.

THE LATEST victory came in convincing fashion at Brighton by a 28-0 score as the Trojans wound up in third place behind champion Bloomfield and runnerup West Bloomfield in the Wayne-Central League's final standings.

Riddling again was the big scorer with two touchdowns and two extra points. Weller added one TD and Leonard Dicks, a guard, also broke into the point department.

The game actually was closer than the score might indicate. Clarenceville had marched 60 yards to score early on a three-yard run by Riddling and that's the way matters stood until the final period.
