

Dems To Hear Sen. Eagleton

Thomas F. Eagleton (D-Mo.) will be guest speaker at the 18th District Democratic Committee's annual congressional dinner Monday, Nov. 10, at the Northwest Inn, 5555 Woodward at Calais in Berkeley.

Since his election in November 1968, Eagleton, 49, has been an outspoken opponent of the ABM system and has been in the forefront of the attack on the Pentagon budget. He has announced his intention to vote against the appointment of President Nixon's nominee

to the Supreme Court, Clement F. Haynsworth Jr.

The contest is sponsored by the MOD-Teens club of the Wayne County Chapter, The National Foundation - March of Dimes.

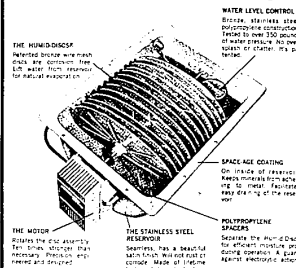
Each community in Wayne County will select its own candidate who will compete in the judging to select 10 finalists, which will be held Saturday, Dec. 6.

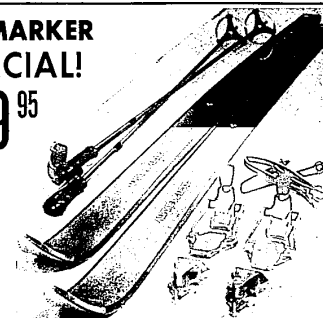
