Processing 100,000 volumes is a year-long task. Work on the present sale began in September, 1978 with vol-

unteers gathering books from many sources.

After they are collected, books are sorted onto plain wood shelves labeled, music, fiction, history and so on. They are oriced and boxed for storage until sale time.

Volunteer finds during this process may range from a valuable first edition to a textbook inscribed with the name of a former classmate, to an oddity like the 1909 volume "Toasts" by Margaret Waters.

Utimately, books will be sorteed into more than 50 categories, including art, biography, business and finance, children's books, history, humor. law, mystery, poetry, hobbies travel, science fiction and others.
