Farmington schools shape up

It's the annual floor-to-ceiling, no-cobwebs-left-in-the-corners cleaning, and it's going on right now in Farmington's public schools.

"We have to meet the deadline before school starts," said-Clayton Currell, a foreman. "We'll be working right up to the last minute."

Currell said that 75 maintenance and operations employees are scrubbing, mopping, waxing, painting and generally making sure that all systems are go in the district's feelementary, four junior bigh and three senior high schools. Some important projects: Kenbrook Elementary School is getting a new roof, and North Farmington High School's gymnasium is being repaired. At other schools, furnace and swimming pool filtration systems are being checked, broken windows replaced, walls and floors scrubbed clean and other odds and ends being taken care of before the students come marching back.

Barring a teachers' strike, Farmington's public schools are scheduled to open on Sept. 5.
