

LIT lunch lectures on art, architecture

Once again this year, the Design Lecture Series of Lawrence Institute of Technology's School of Architecture will present a program of lunchtime lectures on various aspects of art and architecture.

The series begins Sept. 11 with a presentation by Aleksis Lahi, free-lance designer, on "How Personal Experiences Relate to Design" and will conclude on April 15, 1980, with a lecture by Harold VanDine, head designer of Straub, VanDine, Dierman, on his company's current works. All of the lectures will run from noon to 1 p.m. in the LIT architecture auditorium, 21000 10 Mile at Northwestern in Southfield. The lectures are free of charge and open to the public.

Oct. 16 — Mary Wright, who owns and operates the Xochipilli Gallery of Rochester, will talk about "The Beginning Collector's Guide to Graphics."

Oct. 30 — Joseph Olivieri, associate professor of Architecture, Lawrence Institute of Technology, School of Architecture, will discuss "Comfort and Energy Conservation: Are They Compatible?"

Nov. 6 — Tivadar Balogh, architect and instructor of architecture, University of Michigan, will discuss "Works in Progress."

Dec. 4 — Leonard Elise, interior designer and assistant professor of architecture, Lawrence Institute of Technology School of Architecture, will talk about "An Overview of Interior Architecture."
