

# See Michigan—take a ride

Make the most of the last days of summer with some freewheeling rides around Michigan.

For different ways to travel, go island hopping by ferry, bridge or boat, or see the sand dunes in a dune scooter or a sailplane high above the Lake Michigan shore.

Other transportation oddities in Michigan include a ride on a chairlift to the top of a giant ski slide, a train trip into the darkness of an iron mine or a river cruise by canoe or paddlewheel.

Ferry service to Isle Royale National Park in Lake Superior takes six hours from Houghton and about 4 1/2 hours from Copper Harbor. Mackinac Island in the Straits of Mackinac is reached by ferry from St. Ignace or Mackinaw City, with the trip taking between 18 and 35 minutes depending on the line.

Cars are banned from Isle Royale and Mackinac Island, but the family car can go along on the Chessie System ferry across Lake Michigan. That trip from Ludington to Manitowish and Keweenaw, Wis., takes four hours while the Milwaukee crossing is six hours.

The Drummond Island Ferry also transports cars, and it is about a 20-minute ride from DeTour across the St. Marys River.

Hill Island and Island No. 8 are the only islands in the Lewis Chainaux chain near Cedarville which can be reached by car via bridge and causeway. The remainder of the 30 islands in that Lake Huron chain are accessible only by boat.

In the Detroit area, residents of Grosse Ile commute to work in their cars via two bridges which span the Trenton Channel of the Detroit River.

For an island trip back to horse and buggy days, take a carriage tour of Mackinac Island which lasts about 1 1/2 hours and includes glimpses of Fort Mackinac, the Grand Hotel and the Governor's Mansion.

Horse-drawn carriages at Dearborn's Greenfield Village give way to sleighs with each winter snowfall. Although it only lasts about 15 minutes, a ride aboard the sternwheeler

Sunawac at Greenfield Village can recall days of plantations and river-boat gamblers.

A longer trip is available on the Au Sable River Queen paddlewheel boats near Oscoda. Those two-hour excursions give tourists glimpses of deer, raccoons, beaver and other wildlife. The Au Sable is a favorite of canoeists and the main stream from Grayling to Mio is under consideration for designation as a National Recreation and Scenic River. Rental canoes are available at both towns.

Boat and train trips are popular ways to see the natural and man-made wonders of the Upper Peninsula. The Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore, with its colorful array of unusual rock formations, can be viewed on cruise ships which hug the Lake Superior shoreline during 37-mile, 2 1/2-hour narrated tours.

The Soo Locks Boat Cruises take passengers through the American and Canadian locks, while the Soo Locks Tour Train gives a different view as it crosses the International Bridge 175 feet above the locks.

The thundering spectacle known as Michigan's "Little Niagara," created by the 48-foot drop of the Upper Tahquamenon Falls, is reached easily via two boat-train rides. The Toonerville Trolley and Riverboat Ride is located off M-28 at Soo Junction, eight miles east of Hulbert Corners. The Tom Sawyer River Boat and Paul Bunyan Timber Train trip is located at Slater's Landing, 10 miles north of Hulbert off M-28.

Both narrated trips offer a close-up look at the beautiful Tahquamenon River and such wildlife as deer, muskrat and an occasional bear. The Toonerville Trolley trip lasts 6 1/2 hours while the Tom Sawyer-Paul Bunyan excursion runs about 4 1/2 hours.

At the Iron Mountain Iron mine at Vulcan, visitors don hard hats and raincoats before boarding the electric train which takes them through 2,600 feet of underground drifts and tunnels to see demonstrations on iron mining.

Tourists can ride a chairlift 810 feet to the summit of Copper Peak, near Ironwood, the only ski flying

hill in the Americas. From there, it is a 188-foot elevator ride to the Observation Deck, where on a clear day it is possible to see not only the Upper Peninsula woods and Lake Superior but into Wisconsin, Minnesota and Canada.

Some people soar above the Lake Michigan sand dunes while others skim them aboard dunemoobiles.

The Frankfort airport annually becomes headquarters for the National Soaring and Hang Gliding Festival the first week of July. Almost every weekend of the year, soaring enthusiasts can be seen in their motorless airplanes riding the air currents along the tall bluffs lining the Lake Michigan shore.

Goshorn Lake Dune Schooners, located at Saukuck and the Macwoods Dune Rides at Mears take tourists up and down sand dunes, which reach as high as 150 feet. Both are half-hour rides and offer ample opportunity for picture-taking.

## New courses
