Parents must make youngsters aware of the dangers of crossing streets or riding bikes without proper safety precautions. Gibson said. He added that two-thirds of all child predestrian mishaps occur at mid-block. Combine the inattentive motorist who drives too fast for conditions with the unpredictable child who crosses mid-block and you have the major ingredients for tragedy. To help inform school-age youngsters about traffic safety dangers, the Auto Club annually conducts traffic safety assemblies involving more than 10,000 Michigan students, holds seminars for safety patrol directors in 2,000 schools and stages statewide adult crossing guard workshops for law enforcement officials representing 305 Michigan cities.

The Auto Club also furnishes materials for more than 55,000 school safety patrollers, a service it has been providing since 1919.

The Auto Club suggests that parents teach children these simple rules for walking or riding bicycles to school.

Walk only on the sidewalk. If there isn't one, walk facing traffic on the shoulder of the road.

Cross only at designated school-crossings.

Look both ways before crossing and never run across streets.
