

Grange home cookin'

No Fall Festival is complete without a visit to the Plymouth Grange Hall on Union Street just around the corner from Kellogg Park, the focal point of Festival activities.

Festival habitués return year after year for their annual sampling of the Grange's homemade cookies, pies and hot doughnuts. There also is a variety of other homemade treats — vegetable soup, split pea and ham soup, hot turkey and hot beef loaf sandwiches, sloppy joes and slices of field grown beefsteak tomatoes.

JIM HENRY will be running the doughnut making machine again this year. The hot fried cakes with their crispy crusts can be purchased singly or by the dozen.

Louise and Jesse Tritten will be mixing up the batter for dozens of cookies to be baked in the Grange kitchen. Last year they sold about 250 dozen. They make three varieties: oatmeal chocolate chip, sugar, and molasses.

Helen Eckles will be rolling out crusts

for the pumpkin and apple pies. The Grange's No. 1 pie maker baked between 250 and 300 pies last year. They were so busy turning them out that they lost count.

Each year, it gets a little more difficult to put on the fall feast as several longtime Grange members have passed away in recent years. The stamina needed to work the long hours isn't as readily found. Arthritic hands can't peel bushels of apples for pies as they once did. They try to fill in the ranks and carry on.

BECAUSE the Colonial Kiwanis Club will not be serving its spaghetti dinner at noon on Thursday, the Grange will provide the featured festival lunch on opening day.

They plan to have hot beef loaf sandwiches, individual pizzas, vegetable soup, beverage, and the cookies, pies and doughnuts. They will be served at the Grange Hall.

During the four-day festival, a gifts and crafts show will be take over the upper floor of the Grange Hall. There will be no admission charge for this show.


