Jews in Egypt, Iran to be topic

Jewish communities in distress will be the topic of an 8:30 p.m. lecture on Tuesday, Sept. 18 at Congregation Bnai Moshe in Oak Park.

Chairman of the special event are Mark Eichner of Southfield and Pearlina Bodin of Oak Park.

Featured speakers whose topic is: "It's Hard to Be a Jew — Jewish Communities in Distress" will be Henri Bizouzi and Dr. Friezo Banoni. They will focus on the lives of Jewish people in Egypt and Iran.

Banoni, a gynecologist, was born in Hamadan, Iran and was graduated

from the Alliance Israélite Universelle and the Tehran Medical School. He immigrated to the United States in 1968 and currently is in private practice and on the staff at Sinai, Grace-Harper and Beaumont Hospitals.

Bizouzi, a local businessman, is a native of Cairo. He emigrated from Egypt in the 1950s and lived for a time in France and then Israel. He served in the Israeli Air Force from 1961 to 1964.

He is chairman of the Committee of Jews from Arab Countries. The public may attend the lecture at no charge.

- Deadline for entries is September 15, 1979. An entry fee of \$5.00 (Five Dollars) is required to guarantee display space for your entry. Your entry fee will be refunded if available display space is filled.
- Contestants should enter the Livonia Mall at the "H" entrance, 9:30 p.m., Wednesday, October 17, 1979. Contestants will remove their "Incredible Machines" after 5:30 p.m., Sunday, October 21. Entries not picked up Sunday will be discarded.
