Household repairs such as new roof tile or water heaters as well as minor replacements are handled by the complex instead of the individual. If an appliance has been missed, the complex will bill the occupant for the repairs and replacements.

ONE OF THE attractions of living in Avon Hills according to Lawton is the opportunity to build a financial foundation for the future.

## Mediator will settle suit against schools

Oakland Circuit Judge Francis O'Brien Tuesday ordered local mediation a \$1 million lawsuit filed against the Farmington Public Schools three years ago by the parents of an East Junior High School student electrocuted during a shop class in January 1976.

Mr. and Mrs. Wallace Kourtjian filed suit on behalf of their 13-year-old son, Robert, in October 1976. The eighth

grader was killed when the electric buffer he was using short-circuited.

The suit charges the school violated sections of the National Electric Code and the Michigan Industrial Occupational Safety Health Act.

Court clerk Sharon Finney said the case will go before a mediation board in about two months. If neither party is satisfied with the proposed settlement, the case will go to trial.

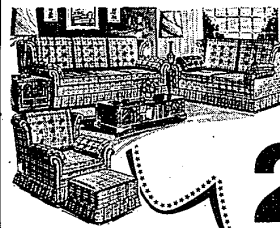

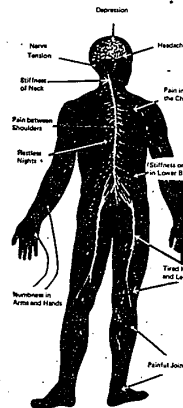

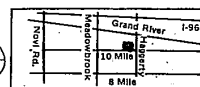
