

## Children's programs scheduled

The fall brings a variety of programs to color the cool days for children of all ages at the Farmington Community Library. Both branches of the library will be presenting an array of programs which bring literature to life.

Several programs will be open to elementary or pre-school age groups who can attend without registering. Pre-schoolers can attend "Dr. Seuss on the Loose" from 2 p.m.-2:30 p.m. on Sept. 25 and "Color My World" from 10:30 a.m.-11 a.m. on Oct. 12 at the Farmington Community Library on Liberty.

For elementary school-aged children, "A Chorus of Ghosts" will be presented from 2 p.m.-3 p.m. on Oct. 20 at the Farmington branch. Participants should bring a mirror and two grocery bags.

Open programs at the Farmington Hills Community Library on Twelve Mile include "Who's Who?" from 2 p.m.-2:30 p.m. on Oct. 1 and "Up, Down and Touch the Ground" from 10:30 a.m.-11 a.m. on Oct. 18. Both events are for pre-schoolers. Elementary school children can attend "Adventures through Film" from 2 p.m.-3 p.m. on Oct. 13 and "Ghosts and Ghosts and Things that Go Bump in the Night" from 2 p.m.-3 p.m. on Oct. 27.

AN IMPORTANT date to remember this fall at the library is Sept. 21, which marks the beginning of registration for programs having a limited enrollment. From 9 a.m.-11 a.m. on Sept. 21, registration must be made in person by a parent only. Thereafter, registration may be made in person or by telephone.

Children may register for only one program in an effort to be fair to all. Residents of Farmington and Farmington Hills will be given first preference with a waiting list provided for all others.

Registration required programs for varied ages of pre-schoolers at the Farmington branch will include "Learning to Play - Playing to Learn" for 2 and 3-year-olds and parents; "A Harry Happening" for 3, 4 and 5-year-olds; "Mother Hubbard's Cupboard" for 3, 4 and 5-year-olds; "Science for Toys" for three and four-year-olds; "Start with Art" for 4 and 5-year-olds and "Storyhour Journey" for 4 and 5-year-olds.

At the Farmington branch several registered programs for elementary school-aged groups will be offered. First and second graders can enjoy "Back to Nature" while third and fourth graders can join "In Search of Dinosaurs." For fifth and sixth graders "Show Me Your Song" and "Reader Roundtable" will be presented.

Registration required programs at both libraries will begin Oct. 1 and continue for five-week sessions through Nov. 1 unless otherwise noted. Please contact the Farmington branch library at 474-7770 for further information on the programs.

THE FARMINGTON HILLS branch will offer many registration required programs, also. Pre-schoolers may choose from "Mother Hubbard's Cupboard" for 3, 4 and 5-year-olds; "A Harry Happening" for 3, 4 and 5-year-olds; "The Shape of Me" for pre-schoolers and parents; "Tricky Treats" for 4 and 5-year-olds; "Rainbow Story Treasures" for 4 and 5-year-olds.

First and second graders can join "Creative Dramatics" at the Farmington Hills branch while "Crazy Concoctions" is offered for third and fourth graders. Fifth and sixth graders can join "Around the World in Crafts" and "Readers Roundtable."

These registration required programs at the Farmington Hills branch will also be presented in five-week sessions, beginning Oct. 1 through Nov. 1. Please contact the library at 553-0300 for details on programs, dates and times.

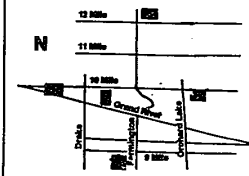
