Drama offered on child abuse

"Dessie," a play depicting an isolated, desperate woman coming to terms with her own abusive behavior toward her child, will be presented at Madonna College, Livonia at 3 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 23.

Written and performed by Conrad and Linda Bishop, members of a professional touring group, the 45-minute play probes the roots of violence in one woman's isolation and ignorance.

During the past three years, "Dessie" has toured 30 states with more than 350 performances for child welfare professionals, volunteer agencies and grassroots audiences to a very strong response.

The production is integrated with a

discussion forum, and has been featured at national conferences on child abuse and foster care, performed for the staff of the Office of Child Development in Washington.

Following a performance for the Michigan Department of Social Services, the state's program specialist called the play "the best live on media depiction of the abusive parent and typical community response which I have encountered."

Tickets for "Dessie" will be on sale in the administration building, 36000 Schoolcraft Road, from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, or at the door on the day of the performance, in the Student Activities Center.

Tickets are \$2.50 per person, \$1 for students and senior citizens.
