

IN THE POCKET

High scoring reached an early season peak on the area's bowling lanes during the past week. When the final pin fell Anita Cantaline's Jac-Ro team and Bob Jawor's Pro Sports combination were virtually assured of high places in the national rankings.

In the Bowlerette's League at Luxury Lanes Monday night, Anita and her mates rolled a 3078 series with a middle game of 1110 which is certain to cause national attention.

Meanwhile in the Little Caesar's Classic at Westland, Jawor and company turned in 3361 series that included games of 1127, 1134 and 1100. This is high for the state thus far.

To aid Anita with her Jac-Ro team, Elvira Topleer contributed a 625, Cheryl Mertz added a 654, Pat Rizzo a 578 and Bonnie McKay a 549.

Jawor paced his own team with a 757 to lead the Little Caesar's League. He had games of 247, 258 and 246. Mike Lee was right behind him with a 733 that included a 258 middle game. Jay Dishong came through with games of 243 and 263 in 706.

The women also did well in the Classic when Gerri Beattie had a 269 in 615, Julie Zimmerman a 582 and Leandra Michalak a 564.

TWO OTHER BOWLERS broke the 700 barrier in the terrific assault on the pins.

At Farmington Lanes, Jim Schaefer, bowling in the Junior House League rolled a 702 that included games of 264 and 246. And in the Super Bowl Classic, Tom Snead broke the 700 barrier with a 724.

He got away to a grand start with games of 255 and 267, but fell to 207 in his final. His nearest rival was Tom Wojowski with a 643.

ALONG WITH THE high scores another honor came to the Farmington Lanes bowlers when Jim Hamlin, son of Fred Hamlin, the owner, was awarded a bowling scholarship at Saginaw Valley College.

This is a new program among the colleges, and young Hamlin is one of the first to be so honored.

IN OTHER good performances at Farmington, Berry Van Dike showed the way in the Saturday Junior H league with a 246 in 614. In the High School Circuit, Dave Hamilton was high with 246 in 668 and Linda Hamlin showed the way in the girls league with 190 in 529. In the Mixed Classic, Rudy Pearson was high with a 247 in 668.

BETTY MOELLER took top honors in the Livonia Ladies Classic by winning the third game with 211-43 — 254 and the series with a 495-129 — 626. In

the other games, Delores Dowhan shared first with 165-44 — 209 and Dot Fulton matched it with 187-22 209. Joan Lewis then won the second with 199-30 — 229.

DICK HALE and Brad Coyne put on a great show in the Pin Busters league at Plaza Lanes before Dick emerged the winner with counts of 212, 219 and 229 for 559. Coyne dumped to a 176 after games of 230 and 242.

DICK QUITON learned what it is like to draw a frown from Lady Luck. After piling up 10 strikes in a row in the St. Edith League at Woodland Lanes. He left up the No. 10 twice and had to settle for a 286 game.

IN OTHER GOOD performances, Ron Beyer paced the TGIF loop a loop at Garden Lanes with a 598 to beat Bob Williams by 19 pins. At Merri Bowl, Peggy Jackson showed the way in the doubles with 598, which was 15 pins better than Mary Motakasi in second place. Sue Starnett landed third with 576. In the Ladies League at Super Bowl, Linda Uherek was high with 560, three pins more than Trish Connell. In the Senior Citizens League, Clarence Sierakowski was high with 244 and Tom Snead who earlier had the 724 posted a 656 in the regular men's league, but finished second to Larry Sautou who closed with a 233 for 658.

Falcons top NF

Farmington's girls swimmers established three varsity records and qualified for the state meet in three events enroute to a 101-70 victory of cross-town rival North Farmington last Tuesday.

The Falcons won both relays, beating the state-qualifying times in both. Dawn Stanton, Sally Schueler, Kim Pogue and Laura Edwards were clocked at 2:00.3 in the 200-yard medley relay.

In the 200-yard freestyle relay, Schueler, Pogue, Amy Edwards and Margaret Richards splashed to a varsity record time of 5:34.2.

Sally Schueler set a new team record in the 50-yard freestyle, winning the event in 26.2, three-tenths of a second off the state-qualifying time.

Pogue qualified for state and set a record in the 500-yard freestyle, going the distance in 8:27.8. Despite the record onslaught by Farmington, North managed to come away with five individual first-place finishes. Kirstin Kinsman and Debby Houser each won two events, Kinsman taking the 200-yard individual medley (2:25.3) and the 100-yard backstroke (1:07.9).

Houser won both the 200-yard freestyle (2:06.6) and the 100-yard freestyle (58.4).

Mary Shuey was North's other winner, capturing the 100-yard breaststroke (1:14.9).

Farmington's other winners were Stanton in the 100-yard butterfly (1:06.4) and Jennifer Ratliff in diving (158.8 points).

Farmington, now 3-0 on the season, hosts Trenton Thursday, while North travels to Northville.

Golfers tied for lead

Farmington Harrison's golfers finished the first half of their season on a winning note by beating Plymouth Canton, 211-218, Monday.

The victory kept Harrison in a tie for the Western Six League lead with Northville, both at 4-1. Waterford Mott, which lost last week to Harrison in overtime, was beaten Monday by Northville by a single stroke and is now third at 3-2.

Despite the victory over Canton, Hawk Coach Bill Spencer wasn't pleased with his team's performance on its home course, San Marino Golf Club. In beating Mott, the squad had carded a 200-stroke total before going into overtime.

Ted Kallgren tied for medalist honors against Canton with a 39. Dave Visser of Canton also shot a 39.

Brian Wright was next for the Hawks with a 42, and Dave Hawthorne and Kirk Perry both shooting 43s and Steve Rosenthal coming in with a 44.

The showdown between the two league leaders is Thursday, when Northville plays Harrison at San Marino. Despite being Harrison's home course, the Hawks have never beaten Northville on it. The match will begin at 3:30 p.m.
