Art by nonagenarian displayed at gallery

Oil paintings and pastel drawings by 90-year-old Danish-American Karl Larsen are on exhibit at Galerie de Boicourt, 315 Fisher Building, through Oct. 5.

The two-week exhibit and sale is the culmination of Larsen's most recent work. Oil landscapes, figuratives and still-life are complemented by an extensive collection of sensitively rendered, pastel nude studies.

A special feature of the Larsen exhibit is the complete hand-colored, illustrated biography of former General Motors president and General of the U.S. Army, William S. Knudsen.

Knudsen commissioned Larsen in the '40s to trace his career in rhyme. This hand-bound hand-lettered book was published in a limited edition of 50. The Knudsen biography now belongs to private, permanent collections across the country, including the libraries of General Eisenhower and Henry Ford II. Galerie de Boicourt will also present a collection of Larsen's rhymed, illus-

trated Christmas greetings, annually given to friends and associates throughout the decades.

Larsen was born in 1889 in Denmark. A commercial artist for 50 years, he worked at almost everything and anything, soldiered during World War I in the U.S. Army, returned to Denmark to work on a leading Copenhagen newspaper as an illustrator, cartoonist and portrait artist, and studied at the Royal Danish Art Academy.

He returned to the United States in 1924 and worked as a commercial artist in Detroit until his retirement in 1965. He has been profusely painting and drawing ever since.

A member of Detroit's Seaweb Club for 40 years, he has recently had a one-man exhibit and has participated in numerous group shows. Larsen also had a one-man exhibit with Galerie de Boicourt in Birmingham during the early '70s, which highlighted his oil drawings. Since then his work is in the permanent collection of Birmingham's Sly Fox Restaurant.
