# Where does inflation hit?

I just spent an evening in an agonized discussion of salary raises. Almost all of the difficulty had to with the impact of inflation.

Then my wife came home reporting the frustrions and problems caused by he public school contract negotiations for teachers. Again we are dealing with inflation.

We see three-year contracts set with the anticipation that the same trend of inflation will continue. What is such a trend costing us in spiritual and moroal terms?

There are the individual dislocations caused by the resulting unemployment. There are the hard-ships and the anxieties caused for those on fixed incomes.

I ALSO RAISE the question of how well our edu-cational and religious institutions will survive dur-ing such a period.

Schools and churches are funded to a great ex-tent by voluntary commitments. Somehow during this inflationary time "cost of living" may need to include shifting our resources to institutions which provide the ground for human and spiritual free-dom and development.

We find our society able to absorb immense in-creases in medical costs. Congress cuts several bil-lions of dollars out of human service budgets and gives a like amount in "inflation cost" increases to the military budget.

The concept of cost of living somehow must in-clude the concept of maintaining essential human and morally constructive services.

VALUES NEED to change. Will we give the economic power to the American Medical Association, the industrial complex and the great corporations and minors?

We as individuals can take charge of our own priorities. We can decide that our churches and our schools need increases to keep pace. We can act in ways to pressure other institutions to control their increases.

We need to search our values and change our lifestyles if we are to preserve what is best in our lives. We can work to support a millage vote and give up a weekend vacation trip.

We can decide that our religious institutions will get our increased support and let other people know of our decision. We can choose to support and main-tain those things which are most important to our lives, even in the face of "cost of living."
