The City of Farmington Hills Planning Commission will give formal consideration to a Proposed Amendment to the Text of the City of Farmington Hills Zoning Ordinance, which Amended Ordinance would in part read as follows:

Section 1.
Article IX-OS-1 and OS-1A Office-Service Districts, Section 901. Principal Uses Permitted: is hereby amended in part to read as follows:

Section 901. Principal Uses Permitted:
In a OS-1 and OS-1A Office-Service District, no building or land shall be used and no building shall be erected except for one or more of the following specified uses unless otherwise provided in this Ordinance:

- Office buildings for any of the following occupations; executive, administrative, professional, accounting, writing, clerical, stenographic, drafting and sales.
- Medical offices, including clinics; hospitals.
- Sanitariums or convalescent homes, in the OS-1 District only.
- Banks, credit unions, savings and loan associations, and similar uses; drive-in facilities as an accessory use only.
- Off-street parking lots.
- Churches, in the OS-1 District only.
- Other uses similar to the above uses.
- Accessory structures and uses customarily incident to the above permitted uses.

The proponent in this matter is the City of Farmington Hills Planning Commission, which seeks this Amendment in order to restrict the placement of Sanitariums or Convalescent Homes and Churches from the OS-1A Office District.

Any person who is interested is invited to participate in the discussion of the proposed Zoning change. Copies of the Zoning Text and Zoning Map may be observed at the Farmington Hills City Hall on any business day between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.
