Can a successful television reporter

Can a successful television reporter who enjoys the instant recognition from Detroit's viewing public find happiness tucked away inside a radio broadcast booth?

Jack McCarthy, Channel 7 reporter, thinks so. McCarthy is the latest media personality to join the airwaves at Garden Citys WCAR (formerly WIID) radio station. Bob Allison of "ask Your Neigbbor" radio fame was the first. And it was Allison who steered McCarthy to WCAR.

At 42, McCarthy, who lives with his wife, Carol, and sons, Bret and Sean, in Bloomfield Township, says it was time for a move. Although he remains at Channel 7, McCarthy admits his future there is uncertain. He is currently working without a contract. "It think I'm the only one there without one," he adds.

McCarthy's radio program is on weekdays from 11 a.m. to noon on WCAR. It's a call-in interview show but so far McCarthy hasn't had as many calls as he expected from the listening public. He hopes that will change as people hear about the show and his intenp of guests. McCarthy says his years as a television reporter have given him access to a lot of guests. This week he interviewed Emily Gail, owner of Emily's Across the Street, a downtown Detroit emporium; newspaper columnists Nick-

ALTHOUGH things have started out ALTHOUGH things have started out slowly, McCarthy believes radio can be his future. And, for the tall, lean, mellow-voiced McCarthy, it's a chance to return to his career beginnings.

Born in Louisiana, McCarthy grew up in Peoria, Ill. He started working at a radio station there when he was in high school. He screet there were in the

He spent three years in the Army in Germany as a radio announc-er and later graduated from Bradley er and later graduated from stradley University, where he majored in speech and minored in journalism and dramatic arts. Fellow newscaster John Kelly helped McCarthy get his start in Detroit tele-vision. McCarthy started out at WJBK-TV Channel 2 and was among the first


