TV2 staff earn awards

Four members of the WJBK-TV2 staff won first and second place awards in the recent State Bar of Michigan Advancement-of-Justice Awards competition.

Tom Greene and Bob White shared the top award in the Broadcast Category — Greene for his coverage of "The Cartwright Affair," an investigative report on the financial affairs of former State Sen. Arthur Cartwright, and White for his editorials beginning with

"Let's Not Stop With Cartwright."

Second place in the broadcast category was awarded to Otis Buchanan and Tom Fox for "A Time of Crisis," a documentary on the outcome of the Bakke case and its implications to society.

The awards annually honor Michigan news media individuals whose published or broadcast work made outstanding contributions to the advancement of justice in Michigan.

Board supporting local programs

The executive committee of the Channel 56 Board of Directors has announced its support for the management plan for locally-produced programming in the new television season.

The committee endorsed plans for three previously announced local efforts — one a weekly newsmagazine and the second a nightly, live talk show.

The committee then went on to support a plan to expand the scope of the third, weekly presentation, a "Black focus" series to be called "Detroit Black Journal."

"Detroit Black Journal" will resume the program format for that series established last season on Channel 56, complete with a comparable film budget to last year's effort.

ASSOCIATE PRODUCER for the 1978-79 season, Deborah Ray, will assume the producer's responsibilities for the new season of "Detroit Black Journal." The show will begin on or before Dec. 1 of this year, and the other two sustaining series will begin in the last two weeks of October.

Those other two series, "56 Reports" and "Feedback," will, as previously announced, involve the interests and personalities of the entire Detroit metropolitan community, responding to concerns of the public.

Former "Detroit Black News" and "Detroit Black Journal" Producer Ron Scott will produce and host the newsmagazine ("56 Reports"), assisted by Producer Cecilia Garcia. Staff documentary Producer Hal Ewing will produce "Feedback."

The executive committee of the board supports a management proposal that \$5,000 be provided to subsidize a college intern program which will be implemented immediately, aimed at bringing more blacks, Latinos and other community members' experience in public television.

New Station Manager Jack Caldwell (having arrived six weeks ago) suggested to the committee that the growth of Channel 56 can best be accomplished by including among its management team additional minority representation. He has committed himself to increasing this minority presence by the end of the year.

FINALLY, the station committed itself to acquiring current, state-of-the-art electronic news-gathering equipment for its increased news and public affairs effort.

Following the recent executive committee meeting, new Channel 56 Board Chairman James C. Chambers said, "The board and management of Channel 56 are solidly behind this plan. It has a public affairs emphasis with a sensitivity to the needs and interests of the total community, including the various minority communities. We firmly believe that such an emphasis is what is needed to make Channel 56 a first-rate public television station."

Walter Douglas, president of New Detroit, Inc., and a member of the Channel 56 board of directors added his support for the local programming plan, saying, "What has been endorsed will be good for Channel 56 and good for the entire Detroit community."

Polish mass to be televised



A mass for the Polish people, by Pope John Paul II, will be broadcast live, with coverage beginning at 8 a.m.
