conversations. The guys were drinking, the girl was in the background.

"A couple of the guys from the party grabbed them by the arm and escorted them up the steps. Outside, the girl told me 'We crash parties like this all the time.'"

Miss Williams denied she made such

a statement. The youths also denied they drank alcohol inside the home.

Chief Byrnes was at the party but left before the youths arrived and did not learn of the incident, he says, until someone outside his department told him about it two days later.

A few days after the party, Cote, a stock worker at Merchandise Mart in Farmington Hills, and his father, John Cote, went to the Farmington police station to talk with Lee and Byrnes. They talked with Lee. Byrnes was not there.

"I RAISED four sons in Farmington," Cote said. "None has ever been in serious trouble with the law."

"I don't believe they would go in and start a fight."

Cote said he went to the station to get an apology from Lee, and to inquire about his son's \$50 suede vest that was lost in the brawl.

Cote said Lee showed him a report that "was all one-sided, entirely different than what my son said happened."

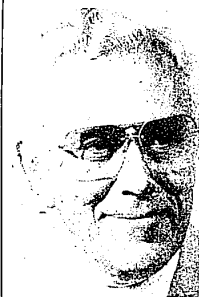
"Lee said he could press charges against the boys for illegal entry. We could press charges for assault and battery," Cote said.

Byrnes, who will stay with the department until Oct. 12, is continuing an internal investigation.

Burnside heads finance team for Methodist hospital system

Neil Burnside of Farmington Hills will take over as senior vice president of finance for Methodist Hospitals of Michigan beginning this month.

He was the assistant controller for Ford Motor Co.'s North American Automotive Operations.

The Methodist system, including the central unit in the medical center of mid-town Memphis and two community satellite hospitals, provides care to more than 120,000 persons annually. Methodists Hospitals Executive Director John Lavery explained Burnside's job assignment.

"Under our new fiscal structure, all financial related functions for the hospital system are being consolidated. Burnside, with more than 25 years experience in all aspects of corporate financial management, is eminently qualified to head this new fiscal division," he said.

He will have responsibility for financial planning for the entire hospital system as well as the day-to-day accounting services and financial information.

As senior finance officer, he will serve on the administrative board and on the finance and personnel committee of the board of managers.

Burnside, 51, has served as treasurer and board member of the Farmington Area Advisory Council (FAAC), a non-profit substance abuse agency. Born in Ohio, he attended Purdue and Vanderbilt universities and earned a master's degree in business administration from Harvard Graduate School of business administration in 1919.
