Whether you want to find a good book to curl up with or to join a group in an enlightening program, there's something at the library for you.

How well do you really communicate? Find out at 7:30 p.m., Oct. 17 at the Farmington branch library on Liberty when the Young Adult Department presents "Doubletalk and Body Language." Featured will be the hilarious film "Doubletalk" which asks 'do we really say what we mean?', followed by a presentation on non-verbal communication by Richard Thompson, provost of Oakland Community College at Orchard Ridge.

Astronomy is the subject for this fall's Young Adult offering at the Farmington Hills Library on Twelve Mile. Guest speakers from the Detroit Astronomical Society will present a slide show and lecture followed by a question and answer period and an outdoor star gazing session. Join them at 7 p.m., Oct. 29.

This month the library will feature two sessions on library use. For general library orientation and research

skills, attend the "Using the Library" session from 10 a.m.-11:30 a.m., Oct. 12 in the Farmington Hills Library.

IN A MORE SPECIALIZED vein, the Farmington branch will offer "Critics Choice," a workshop in literary detective techniques from 10-11:30 a.m., Oct. 30.

Participants will be given guidance finding literary criticism, biographical information on authors and critical reviews.

Join a book discussion group. The Adult Book Discussion group meets at the Farmington Library bi-weekly on Thursdays from 10 a.m.-noon. Regular attendance isn't required; come to one session or to all.

On Oct. 11, the discussion will focus on Canadian author Margaret Laurence's "The Diviners," the story of the life of Morag Gurn.

Two weeks later on Oct. 25, it's "All Our Children: The American Family Under Pressure" by Kenneth Keniston and the Carnegie Council on Children.

Books are available for purchase at the Farmington Branch Library. At the Farmington Hills Branch Library, the Great Books Discussion Group meets on Thursday evenings at 7 p.m. Selections to be discussed this

month are Feyder Dostoyevsky's "Notes from the Underground" on Oct. 4 and "Death in Venice" by Thomas Mann on Oct. 18.

Also at 7:30 p.m. Oct. 18, Joe Dankovich will speak at the Farmington Hills Library on "Death and Dying: A Look At Grief." A noted lecturer, Dankovich will answer questions relating to grief resolution, bereavement and after-life.

PROGRAMS FOR CHILDREN continue with registration for limited enrollment classes scheduled for Oct. 25.

These programs, repeats of the October offerings, include story hour, science, art and crafts and cooking for pre-schoolers.

There are nature crafts, dinosaurs, t-shirt design, creative dramatics, crazy confections and international crafts for school-age children.

For full details on programs and registration, contact a children's librarian.

Not all programs require registration. Open programs at the Farmington branch this month feature "Color My World," a program for pre-schoolers and kindergarten about fall colors.

As Great Lakes Region drill team, these cadets will attend national competition during Christmas vacation at Maxwell Air Force Base in Alabama.

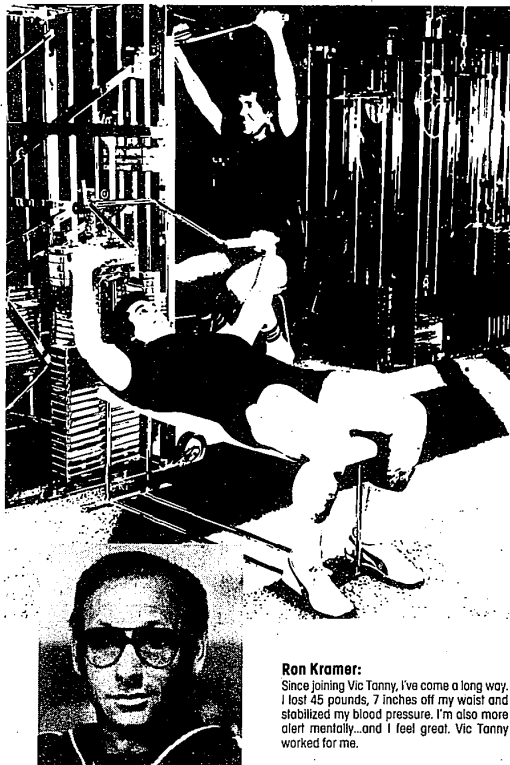
