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OCC seminar will travel to Orient

The Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College will be offering a Far East traveling seminar from Dec. 18 to Jan. 3, in anticipation of the growing interest in travel to China and other parts of the Orient.

Under the direction of Dr. Charles Braun, Spanish and humanities professor, the tour will include Tokyo, Bangkok, Singapore and Hong Kong.

The seminar is open to college students, high school seniors and the public. Students may earn one to three hours of undergraduate credit in Humanities 162. The seminar will meet with educational peer groups in pre-arranged inter-cultural exchanges at universities in each country.

A short course in Conversational Chi-

nese will be offered prior to departure at the Orchard Ridge Campus by Prof. Yuan Chong Chung, former press counselor of the Chinese embassy in Thailand. Those interested in this class should contact Dr. Braun at 476-9400.

Cost of the seminar is \$1,999 per person and includes transportation, sight-seeing, in-country travel by motor coach, first-class hotels, 15 full breakfasts, tour escorts, various admissions and English-speaking guides.

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WSU to shift to semesters

Dr. Thomas N. Bonner, president of Wayne State University, announced that the university will shift to the semester system of classes beginning Sept. 2, 1980.

The move by the university marks a return to the system it left in 1962 when WSU went to the quarter system. The advantages of the semester system are that it will provide more time for teaching complex subjects and give students an earlier opportunity to compete for summer jobs. It also will make WSU more compatible with other institutions, an advantage for students transferring to Wayne State.

Wayne State currently has a fall, winter, spring and summer quarter of 10 weeks of classes and an exam week. Under the new system, the fall and winter semesters would be 15 weeks in length. A summer semester would extend for 14 weeks, with two 7-week half-semester.

Students taking the regular academic year of classes would finish early in the spring as opposed to the mid-June termination they now have. They would also start their fall classes at the beginning of September. These classes now begin at the end of September.

In order to begin the earlier starting time in the fall of 1980, the summer quarter will be a more concentrated eight weeks of classes. Dr. Bonner urged that students begin planning now to adjust their degree and time requirements to the new system.

Summer classes in 1980 will begin June 23 and end Aug. 23. Fall classes will begin Sept. 2 and end Dec. 20. The winter term classes will begin Jan. 9, 1981 and conclude May 4.

President Bonner assured students that costs would be proportional and not result in higher tuition for the school year. Credits will be adjusted and conversion tables will be issued by the university at a later date.

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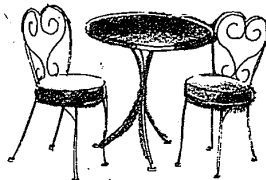
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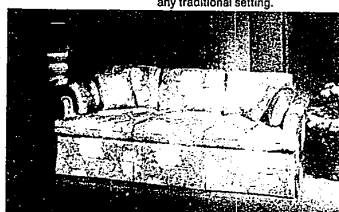

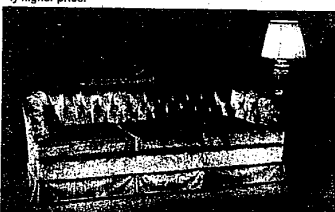
This Queen Anne Chair fits well in any traditional setting.



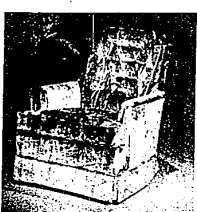
This traditional chair is also available as a swivel rocker at a slightly higher price.



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
