PIONEER WOMEN, Greater Detroit Council, will be well represented when the group's 26th National Biennial Convention takes place in Jerusalem, Israel, in November.
The convention marks the organization's 54th year in supporting a network of educational vocational and child care services in Israel.
It is the only American-Jewish women's organization directly involved in club work with the Arab and Druze women.

An estimated 1,000 delegates will gather at the Western Wall, in a "Salute to Jerusalem," and the second Golda Meir award will be presented to a prominent American who has made a major contribution to relations with Israel. At the last convention, in 1977, the

award went to the late U.S. Senator Hubert H. Humphrey.
The group will meet some of Israel's top leaders, preview a fashion show of original apparel designed and made by students in Pioneer Women-Na'amat vocational schools.

Delegates will visit day care centers, vocational and agricultural high schools, and community centers which are maintained by Pioneer Women-Na'amat.

Na'amat is the group's sister organization in Israel.

The Detroit delegation will visit its own community center, Bet Nehama, located in Rishon L'Zion.

National president of Pioneer Women is Frieda Leemon of Farmington Hills. Ruth Miller of Birmingham is Detroit Council president and Chana Michlin of Oak Park is tour chairman for the conference.

"The Displaced Homemaker."

This meeting is open to all area women who are currently facing this problem. The meeting begins at 8:30 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 17, in Farmington Hills Community Library on 12 Mile Road.

A displaced homemaker is described as one who has dedicated her life's work to her family in the home as an unpaid worker, and now finds that her source of income, usually from her husband, has ended. She is one who now needs help to become financially and emotionally independent.

As director of Common Cause and the Michigan Citizens Lobby, Senator Ross's aim has been to show that citizens have the power to win when they are organized to act.

He was also founder of the Citizens to Save Small Business and co-director and founder of Volunteer Placement Corps, which aided in helping inner-city high school graduates find college or job placement.

Ross represents the 15th Senatorial District. He was elected in 1978 to serve a four-year term.

Three Displaced Homemaker Centers now exist in the state.

The Farmington Branch of AAUW is now conducting a survey in this area to find the needs of the displaced homemaker and the need for a Displaced Homemaker Center here.

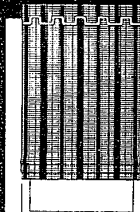
