## Falcons land 3rd

# Stevenson tops swim relays

Livonia Stevenson captured five of the eight events and won the Farmington Swimming Relays last Tuesday at Farmington.

Three relay records were set during the meet. Livonia Stevenson, which scored 90 team points, set one of the records in the 500-yard cresson relay with a time of 5:03.4. Debbie Tracy, Cheryl Balnaves, Sally Rozeman and Jackie Cogo teamed for the win.

Farmington's team of Laura Edwards, Amy Edwards, Sally Schueler and Kim Fogue also broke the cresson relay record but finished second in

the event (5:03.7).

Farmington did set a record, however, in the 200-yard freestyle relay. Poque, Schueler, Amy and Laura Edwards again combined, this time coming out on top with a 1:45.5 clocking. Farmington finished third in the meet with 61 points.

The third record was set by the defending relays team champion West Bloomfield in diving. Monique Ozimkowski and Sue Gierschick accumulated 220.07 points to finish well ahead of second place Farmington Harrison tandem of Sue Humphries and Sue Pickett (118.13).

The Lakers ended in second place in

the team standings with 73 points.

SEVERAL OTHER races were decided by the closest of margins. In the 200-yard breaststroke relay, the Livonia Stevenson team of Jean Shellman, Carol Dotson, Karen Bierman and Stephanie McAree won with a time of 2:23.4.

Just a stroke behind was West Bloomfield's Debby Ochs, Trisha Broderick, Donna Howard and Chris Howard with a time of 2:23.97.

In the 400-yard individual medley relay, West Bloomfield's team of Lisa Liv, Kirsten Schipper, Chris Weber and Ochs touched out North's foursome of

Kirsten Kinsman, Michelle Lister, Debbie Houser and Mary Shuey (4:35.68).

Other Stevenson victories came in the 200-yard backstroke relay, as Heidi Santo, Polly Adezma, Karen Patigian and Patty Zimmerman combined for a first (2:07.7), and in the 400-yard medley relay, in which Patigian, Cogo, Rozeman and Karen Walters finished first (4:31.1).

Stevenson's final victory came in the 200-yard butterfly relay, with Walters, Santo, Adezma and Laurie Smith winning (2:02.2).

In team standings, North Farmington finished fourth (40 points), Novi was fifth (32) and Harrison sixth (31).

# Area's grid teams seek to bounce back

One point. That's all that separated Farmington Harrison from a possible Western Six League (WSL) championship and undefeated season. Instead, the Hawks fell to Livonia Churchill, 8-7, last Friday, ruining their title and playoff hopes.

Two points. That's all that separated North Farmington from a pair of victories and a successful defense of its Northwest Suburban League (NSL) championship. Instead, North was upset by Livonia Franklin, 8-7, last Saturday.

It was the same score that Redford Union beat the Raiders by the previous week.

Twenty-four points. That's all that separated Farmington from Waterford Township last Friday and a possible Inter Lakes League (ILL) title bout with Livonia Stevenson Saturday. Farmington was never a serious challenger for the league title, not against the likes of Stevenson and Waterford.

That was proven against Waterford.

All three Farmington schools are into their last conference games of the season, and none will mean a thing in the final league standings. Harrison will have the same problem North had last week — Hawk coach John Herrington must guard against an emotional letdown when it plays winless Plymouth Canton.

North takes on Westland John Glenn, which is always a tough game and, for the two past years,

has decided the NSL championship. It won't this year, but it should still be a good game.

Farmington plays Stevenson, Stevenson, 5-1 on the year, beat Waterford 38-13 earlier in the season. That's enough to say what kind of a battle is in store for the Falcons.

Also, my personal prediction record is slipping right along with the football fortunes of the Farmington schools. I missed twice last week — the North game and the Harrison contest. My record now is 27-3. Here's how I see this week's games.

### FARMINGTON-STEVENSON

Farmington's loss to Waterford knocked it out of contention for the ILL title and saddled the Falcons with their fourth loss of the season against two wins.

It's too bad, because Farmington is really a much better team than its record indicates. The Falcons losses have come against some first-rate teams: Harrison (5-1 on the season), West Bloomfield (5-1), Bay City Handy (3-3) and Waterford (5-1).

Now they go up against Stevenson (5-1), then Southfield (6-0) and North (3-3). It's been one fun season for Farmington coach Hal Beardley.

Stevenson is coming off a 51-7 win over Millford Lakeland. The tone of the game was set on the first play — a 64-yard touchdown run by Don Hauck.

Richard Paris and Kevin Spala each scored twice, Dave Hall fired a 45-yard touchdown pass to

# Teams to play in Dome

For North Farmington, it's nothing new. Farmington Harrison has been there, too, though it was three years ago.

But for Farmington and Southfield, it'll be the first time and could be the highlight of their season.

All four football teams will participate in a prep football doubleheader at the Pontiac Silverdome on Saturday, Oct. 27, with Farmington tackling undefeated Southfield in the opener and cross-town rivals North and Harrison meeting in the nightcap.

This is the second of four scheduled high school football events hosted at the Silverdome. On the first weekend of the season, Waterford Township played West Bloomfield and Waterford Kettering and Waterford Mott clashed in a doubleheader.

Later in the season, the Catholic League playoffs are scheduled for the Silverdome, with the prep finale coming on the last weekend of the football season with the state football championships.

Southfield entertains hopes that this appearance will be its warmup for a later date. The Blue Jays are 7-0 for the year and, if they remain unbeaten, will make it to the state playoffs.

Once-beaten Harrison has a slim chance of making the playoffs, but only if everyone else in its district loses. The Hawks played for the class A championship in 1976 in the Silverdome.

This will be the third time in two years North has played in the Silverdome. It opened its season there last year against Pontiac Northern and finished the year in the state class A championship contest, which it lost to Traverse City.

THE FIRST game (Southfield-Farmington) will start at 6 p.m., with the second contest tentatively set for an 8:45 p.m. kickoff. Four sections, all in the lower level, will be used to accommodate fans from the four schools.

Gates will open at 5 p.m. Admission will be through the North gate, with parking in lots 2, 3, and 4. Anyone wishing to dine at the Main Event must have a ticket to the game and should make reservations in advance. The Main Event will be open throughout the afternoon.

Ticket prices for admission to both games is \$3. There will be an additional charge of \$1.50 for parking. Tickets are on sale at all four high schools.
