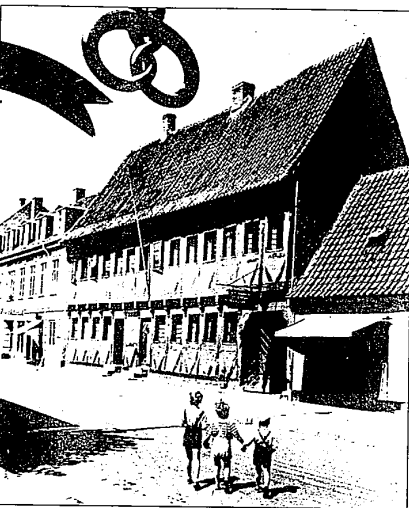


Traveling on film

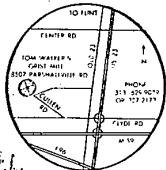

Students play in 'Crazy Cards'

"Crazy Cards," a new play by Taffy Jones, will be staged for students of Way and Hickory Grove elementary schools in Bloomfield Hills.

Performances will be held at 10 a.m. Thursday and Friday, Oct. 18 and 19, at Hickory Grove.

Taffy Jones is director of the Whistle-Stop Theater Workshop, which is being held at Way School for four weeks, sponsored by the Bloomfield Hills Recreation-Community Education Department.

In "Crazy Cards" four charming ladies, Bridget Trump, Acey Stack, Diamond Dealer and Klutzy Hearts, play Crazy Cards to see who will go to the Crazy Cards Nationals where the winner will receive \$10,000.

A PROBLEM arises when Bridget Trump and Acey Stack, who are best friends, both come up with Crazy Cards and only one winner can go to the Nationals.

Klutzy Hearts is the runner-up because she has the Crazy Joker. Judge Shuffle and Judge Poker with the other judges have to decide what is to be done about this dilemma.

Things go from bad to worse and Bridget and Acey are no longer friends.

The students of Way and Hickory Grove will find out how it all comes out.

The Whistle-Stop Theater Workshop is a new course, to be repeated in the winter session for four weeks, with a new play by Taffy Jones.

"These plays are especially designed so that the maximum talents of the young actors can be explored," Ms. Jones said. "Students create their own character's name, costume, make-up,

personality, traits and mannerisms.

"Each student has a part in the dialogue and stage business of the character. Along with this, they follow the script of the play, adding and creating as the play progresses.

"It is like trying out a new play — changing, revising, creating, as you see something never done before come

TAFFY JONES is writer, director and producer of the Whistle-Stop Children's Theater, which is in residence in the Bloomfield Hills School District.

Last year, "Scat," a play about respect, was produced and whistle-

stopped by Conant, Booth, Hickory Grove and Vaughan Elementary Schools, enabling all the district's elementary schools to be a part of the production.

"Scat" will continue this year in the Bloomfield Hills Schools. The program has been asked into the Detroit Schools.

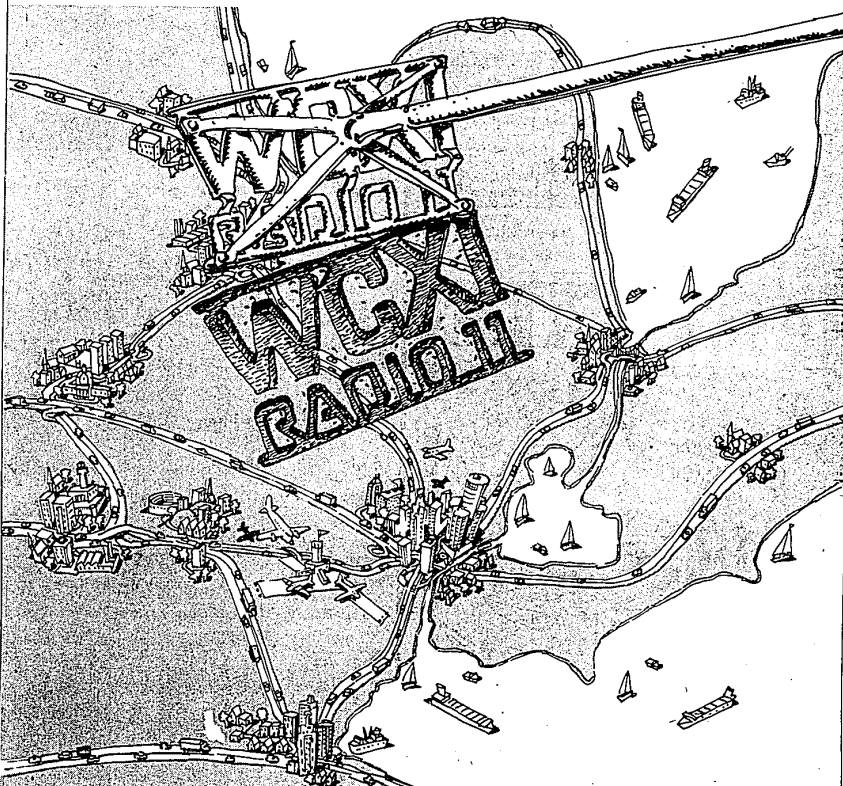

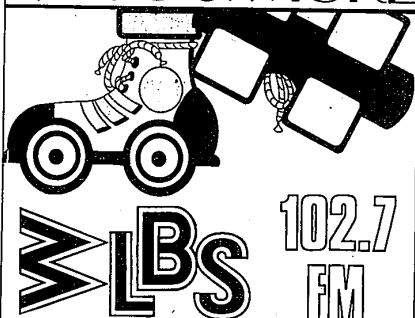
