Purol had just broken the official record for continuous crawling — 24.7 miles in 24 hours and eight minutes. R's a record that will likely stand for awhile. "WHAT DAY is this? I'm really lost," he said in his room at the Detroit Plaza shortly after completing his hands-and-knees hike from Livonia's City Hall to Hart Plaza on the river-

for the charity, said she knew he'd make it.


"I'm not surprised. He makes every-thing he tries," she said. "He just has this little wire hanging loose in his head making him do these
