# Best seller shares secrets of minimizing housework

"Life is too short to stuff a mush

"Life is too short to stuff a mushroom," and "I would rather lie on a sofa than sweep beneath it" are author Shirley Conran's household doctrines.

Ms. Conran was in Southfield recently to promote her international best seller "Superwoman," for every woman and man who hates housework.

The book was published in paperback last month after spending nearly a year on the London Times bestseller list of hardcover books.

Ms. Conran doesn't seem like the type of person who would worry about money management and cleaning tips. She lives in Monte Carlo, her circle of firends includes its setters and millio-firends includes its setters and milliodis includes jet setters and milliones, and she has successfully man-glamor careers in fabric design journalism.

But after her divorce, Ms. Conran found herself with two children, an money and no household help. She taught herself efficiency and wrote "Superwama" to share her secrets of housekeeping success. "Housework interorably expands into as many hours as you have to fill — plus half-an-hour — so it never gets done," is Ms. Conran's law.

"I DON'T do windows," she said with emphasis. "If I have buscuit crumbs on my scarpet, it's not going to make front page news. I wouldn't idly up just because a reporter was coming to interview me. Housework is something that nobody notices until you don't do it." Ms. Conran was editor of the British Observer and Daily Mail. She turned author 15 years ago so she could parlay what she was teaching in the newsparsal the good money by informing readers how to cut their housework by one-thind.

"My book has been rewritten for dif-ferent countries," she said. "The one problem all superwomen share is guilt. They get it from TV commercials mothers-in-law and lying friends. "Superwoman is the first book on housework that men read. They learn how to scramble an egg, scrub the floor and still-have an hour to make love. They re excited about their accom-plishments, and more and more men are discussing housework."

and how they can survive life after 30.
She uses a research team and, she armitted, she doesn't enjoy writing.
The author writes 5,000 words a day,

and her goal is to write one book a
year. She said she can't wait to get
back into the excitement of newspaper
business.

"A SUPERWOMAN can't do every-thing but she avoids doing too much. I found that out when I was very, very ill and nearly ided. I was only up two hours a day. That's when I gave up my newspaper work and decided to write books. I profited from that crisis.

"I figure I'll make \$1 million teaching housework shortcuts. I concentrate on simplifying what many men and women believe are complicated techniques."

 "Some men perpetuate myths about their mothers," she said. "These guys think of them as little gray-haired old ladies with cheeks as rosy as polished apples working their beads off in the house. I believe many died of exhaustion at the age of 25.

Housework isn't like running a factory and it's not a full-time job. When I hired myself as my own cleaning lady, I threw away the iron. Women of America, rise up, wise up and buy drip dries."


