

Democrats Send Local Delegates To State Meet

Farmington's Democrats participated in the Oakland 19th Congressional District Convention Friday night and elected 18 local party workers as members of the 146 District delegation to the State Democratic Convention Aug. 30 and 31 in Grand Rapids.

During the Grand Rapids convention party will choose its nominees for a seat on the State Supreme Court; two members of the State Board of Education; two members of the Michigan State University Board of Trustees; two members of the Board of Governors of Wayne State University; and two members of the University of Michigan Regents.

The party will also choose presidential electors for the November election.

C.W. Hungerford was chairman of the convention's resolutions committee.

Adopted were resolutions calling for a statewide property tax for schools; a return of part of the state weight and gasoline tax to local areas for use on local roads; call for spring primaries and a statewide gun registration law; and recommendations for a national presidential preference primary in the state and the creation of a metropolitan government for the tri-county Detroit area.

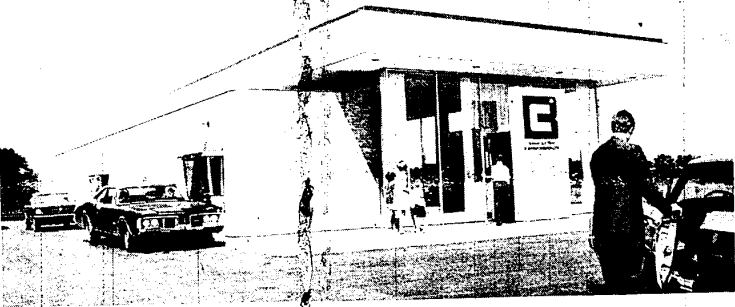

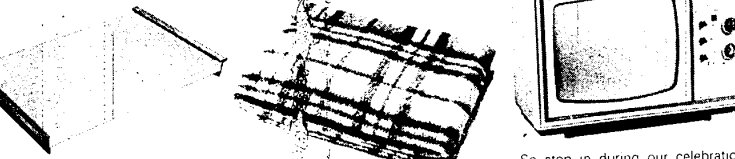
