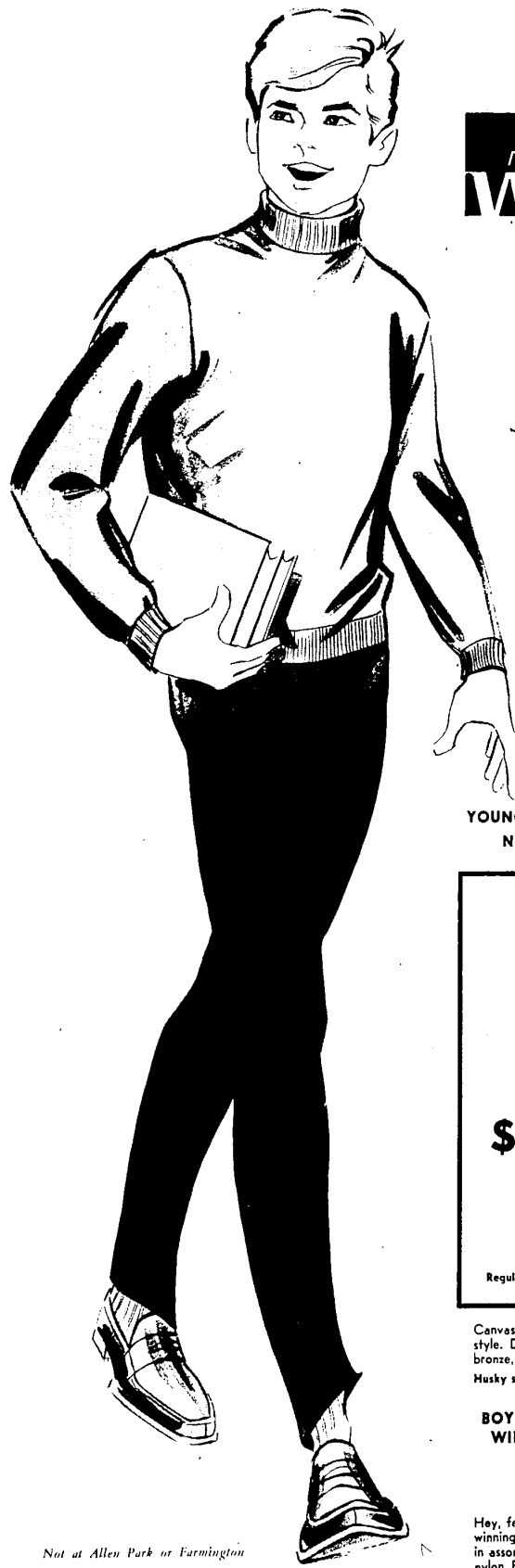

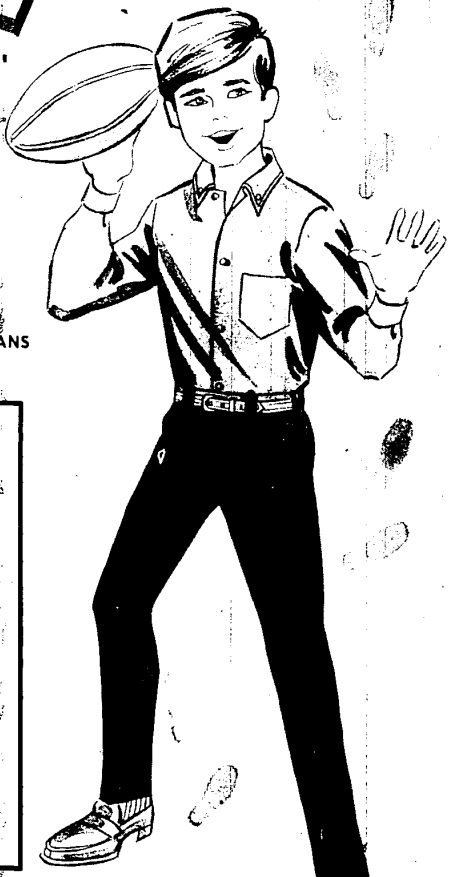

Charles Kelley Heads Planning For Dodge

Charles W. Kelley of Farmington, has been appointed chief engineer and manager of product planning for Dodge cars. Prior to his appointment, Kelley had been chief engineer and planning manager for Chrysler and Imperial.

He succeeds Burton H. Bouwkamp who has been named director of product planning for Chrysler Corporation.

Kelley received his master's degree from the Chrysler Institute of Engineering in 1952 and joined Dodge's car body staff in 1955. He was promoted to managing engineer—quality and service two years later. In 1958, Kelley became resident car engineer and then body engineer in early 1959.

At the end of 1959, he became Dodge managing engineer of body, paint, and trim and in 1960, was named resident engineer at the Dodge assembly plant.

Kelley was named manager of Dart product planning in September, 1961. Two years later, he became manager of Dart and Coronet product planning. From October, 1965 to October 1966, Kelley was manager of Coronet and Charger product planning.
