Nancy Whittemore, a Harrison junior, won the 50 freestyle (26.7) and the 100 butterfly (1:05.5). Harrison's 200 medley relay (Joanne Paynter, Sandy Sinclair, Humphries and Laurie Kigar) finished first in 2:13.5.

Sue Cahill won the 200 free (1:59.4) and the 500 free (5:09.7). Kim Storm took the 50 free (24.6, a varsity record) and the 100 free (55.7). Allison Farquhar topped the 200 individual medley (2:14.6) and the 100 breast (1:08.3).

Farmington won only one event, the 400 freestyle relay. The team of Julie Harrison, Margaret Richards, Allison Gore and Kim Pogue logged a time of 4:11.7. Pogue set a varsity record of 2:02.6 in the 200 free in finishing second. Teammate Sally Schueler set another varsity standard with a 2:23.4 in the 200 IM, good for second place. She also took second in the 100 breaststroke with a 1:11.5.

Raider runners finish 3rd

The weather wasn't the only thing that was bad for North Farmington's harsiers last Tuesday during their Northwest Suburban League championship cross country meet.

The Raiders entered the meet in a three-way tie for first place in the league. Westland John Glenn, Livonia Franklin and North all posted 4-1 conference dual meet records during the season.

The league championship is determined half by dual meet results and half by the championship meet. So any of the three teams had a chance to win the league title by placing first in the league meet.

North failed in its attempt, however, finishing third in both the league meet and overall standings. Glenn captured the league crown, with Franklin finishing second.

Glenn's point total was 36, as its runners placed fourth, fifth, seventh, eighth and 12th. Franklin had 63 team points, North finished with 77. Redford Union had 92. Garden City East had 116 and Redford Thurston was last with 121.

Paul Coburn of Franklin was the individual winner, but the cold, windy weather bothered the runners.

Coburn's winning time (16:46) was nearly a full minute off the league record, set by North's Paul Welch in last year's meet (15:47).

East's Mike Stapleton was second (16:29), with Jeff Brisiwe third (17:03), Santo Campbell (17:37) and Jim Kanceler (17:14) of Glenn fourth and fifth, and North's Rich Fruitman, a sophomore, sixth (17:16).

Jamie Bathwell was North's next highest finisher, coming in 15th (17:47). Teammate Doug McEwen was 17th (17:54). Bruce Rose was 18th (17:56) and Gregg Rapp came in 21st (18:37).

It was a disappointing meet for Rapp, who normally is one of North's top runners. It was also a disappointing day for the rest of the Raider team.

WSL MEET

A series of illnesses hampered any chance Farmington Harrison had in the Western Six League championship cross country meet. The Hawks finished last in the event Tuesday at Cass Benton in Northville.

One of the team's top runners,

Brad Senko, had a cold and couldn't compete. Another top performer for the Hawks, Dave Tremonti, was just returning after missing three weeks with a strep throat.

Several other team members were suffering from the effects of colds.

"Everybody on my team is sick," Hawk coach Al Van Meter said. "The whole team has a cough."

The illnesses proved to be disastrous for Harrison. The team failed to finish five runners, so they didn't score a single team point. Northville won the meet with 32 points, with Waterford Mott second with 52.

In third was Walled Lake Western (80), in fourth Plymouth Canton (84), and in fifth Livonia Churchill (86).

Northville's Harry Cousyounjan was the individual winner with a time of 16:11. Harrison's four finishers were Dave Tremonti (17:51), 24th; Mark Contardi (18:13), 31st; Clay Dillon (18:59), 35th; and Ray Kamoo (19:58), 39th.

Harrison will face North Farmington and Farmington in the city meet Tuesday at Oakland Community College.
