Ross said today and tomorrow, the Senate will discuss ways for the state to enforce collection.

Race track losses also would be deducted from taxable winnings in the amended version of House Bill 4531. The original bill, sponsored by state Reps. Michael Griffin, D-Jackson, and Dama Wilson, D-Hazel Park, would have eliminated a 4.6 percent state withholding tax on winnings of \$1,000 or more at the betting window. State Senator Doug Ross, D-Oak Park, says he has scored a major victo-ry in the Senate by amending a bill which would have made race track winnings exempt from Michigan income tax. Ross said Senator Bill Huffman, D-Madison Heights, co-sponsored the amended version of the bill, which would allow the state to continue tax-ing earnings of \$1,000 or more — but not at the betting window. come ta Twenty percent of such winnings are collected at the window in federal in-

"There's still the question of how the state would collect the money. But half the battle is won, assuming the Senate passes the bill with the amendment and the House agrees with it," Ross said.
