

Solid waste conference probes 2 new state laws

An environmental group is holding a high-powered conference Nov. 7-9 on Michigan's two new solid waste management laws and how state and local governments will cope with them.

Oakland residents who have read about the fights over dumping of industrial and agricultural contaminants may want to attend the conference, entitled "Ending Solid Wastefulness in Michigan."

It's sponsored by the West Michigan Environmental Action Council, which you can call at 616-451-3051 for reservations and display space. Price of the three-day conference, including meals and lodging, is \$87. It will be held at Waldenwoods Conference and Resort Center, eight miles north of Brighton at Hartland.

Among the speakers will be Lt. Gov. James Brickley, state Rep. Alice Tomblin, D-Oakland Township, chief sponsor of the state's Hazardous Waste Management Act, and Richard Seidler, board chairman of Garden State Paper Co., supplier of 10 percent of the nation's newspaper.

Workshops will cover: county planning for waste management; hazardous waste, landfill design and monitoring; and technology in waste management. Hal Conklin, mayor pro tem of Santa Barbara, Calif., and director of its Community Environmental Council, will discuss the citizen's role in waste management decisions.

WILDLIFE PAINTER Guy Coleleach, whose works you've seen in Michigan Out-of-Doors, Sports Afield and the Audubon Magazine, will have 80 prints on display in Detroit next week.

The Coleleach exhibit will be in the Plaza Hotel of the Renaissance Center on the riverfront Nov. 5-10. The showing, on the Promenade Level, is free. Tour hours are 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. each day.

The artist will be on hand from noon to 2 p.m. and 5-7 p.m. each of those days to meet the public and sign prints. Proceeds from the sale of prints will go to the Michigan United Conservation Clubs' conservation and education programs. Over the years, he has helped

raise \$3 million for wildlife and conservation causes.

Among Oakland residents helping to staff the exhibit are Art and Winnie Cruickshank, members of the Detroit Sportsmen's Congress.

HUNTERS HAVE had little success in most of Oakland County in the small game season for pheasants, rabbits and squirrels.

DNR reports hunting pressure is extremely light except in the Bald Mountain Recreation Area of northeast Oakland. Good concentrations of woodcock are reported in northern Oakland.

Southern Oakland hunters report light success on pheasants and rabbits. They're seeing many hen pheasants but few roosters.

FIREWOOD IS scarce if you want to cut your own, the DNR says.

No firewood cutting permits are available for state lands in southeast Michigan and the Thumb.

Permits are available at six state forests with a total of 3.8 million acres of woodland, managed under a multiple use concept by foresters. To get a limited quantity of firewood, call the forest you plan to visit. Here are places and numbers:

Upper Peninsula: Copper Country State Forest, Baraga, 906-353-6153; Escanaba River State Forest, Escanaba, 906-785-2351; and Lake Superior State Forest, Newberry, 906-293-5131.

Northern Lower Peninsula: AuSable State Forest, Mio, 517-826-3211; Mackinac State Forest, Gaylord, 517-732-3541; Pere Marquette State Forest, 616-775-9727.

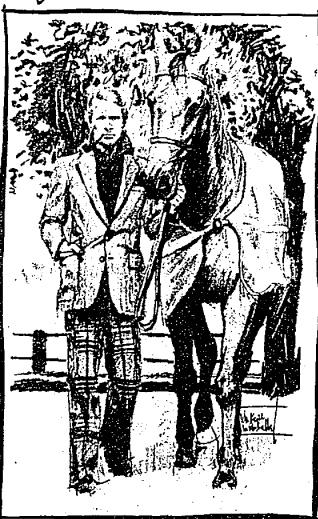
