Court resets hearing for accused murderers

A special pretrial hearing for two Pontiac brothers accused of killing a West Bloomfield widow will resume at 8:30 a.m. Friday in Oakland County Cincuit County

8:30 a.m. Friday in Oakland County Circuit Court.

The evidentiary hearing before Judge Francis O'Brien is to determine whether evidence gained from a third party is admissable in the case against Charles and Daniel Meyers.

Charles, 23, and Daniel, 21, are charged with first-degree murder in the beating death of Gladys Smith, 72, who lived alone in her Pontiac Trail home near Haggerty Road. Mrs. Smith was killed June 28, 1978.

The evidentiary hearing began Oct.
4, 1979 but was interrupted when other charges against the brothers were brought to trial.

That case involved an armed rob-bery stemming from a July 6, 1978 in-ident in Keepo Harbor. The trial last-ed 1½ weeks.

A jury deliberated six minutes in convicting the bröthers of robbing Leo's Pour House, now called the Fire Station, located at 3159 Orchard Lake

INFORMATION GAINED during investigation of the robbery led Keepo Harbor Police Chief William Holloway to alert West Bloomfield Police seeking suspects in the murder of Mrs. Smith. West Bloomfield Detective Lt. Wayne Allen is expected to take the stand again when the pretrial exam

resumes Friday.

Allen, under cross-examination at the first session of the pretrial, admitted some reservations about methods used to obtain evidence in the murder

He also testified that some reasons given as basis for issuing a warrant in the case were not wholly true. The warrant was sought to search the Pontiac home of the Meyers' parents.

The brothers were extradicted from Texas in May where they were being held on charges of robbery committed in that state.

A fellow Texas prisoner, apparently arrested with the Meyers, told Texas authorities he had information relating to the West Bloomfield slaying, police said. His information was allegedly gained from Daniel Meyers, according to testimony.

The man also testified that he offered to find out more details if he were placed in a cell with Daniel. He was interviewed by Allen the day after the two were presumably placed in the same cell.

Suspect convicted in drug slayings

Dorchester Harris was convicted on two counts of first degree murder Tuesday in Oakland County Circuit Court.

The jury of seven women and five men deliberated approximately four hours before returning the maximum verdict against Harris for March 13 stabbing deaths of Donald and Mary Lou Freedman of West Bloomfield.

Harris, 47, of Detroit listened impassively as he heard the jury foreman read the verdict, his wife Nelle Mach Harris reported.

He had pleaded self-defense.

He had pleaded self-defense. "I was expecting it," said Mrs. Harris, who attended every session of the two-week long trial although. Self-defense and the two-week long trial although. First degree murder carries with it a maximum penalty of life imprisonment. Sentencing its scheduled for 9 a.m. Nov. 9 before Circuit Court Judge William Beer. The jury had four options, Beer told then: acquittal, first degree murder, second degree murder or manisalgebre. He charged them with responsibility to reach a separate verdict on each killing.

THE VERDICT comes seven months after the Freedmans were found stabbed to death by Mrs. Freedman's Syear-old son. Their arms and legs were bound with coat hangers in the living room of their Horseshoe Drive home.

Statements made at the pre-trial hearing led both attorneys to agree as a fact that the boy was in the house but never saw Harris with a own.

Harris took the witness stand to testify he stabbed the Freedmans in self-defense during a dispute over a drug transaction, then tied them up. Harris said he sold drugs for Freedman, reserving some for himself as payment. Both attorneys told the jury to accept as fact that Freedman was a drug dealer. 
