# Our Lady of Mercy cagers receive No. 1 ranking in poll

Farmington Our Lady of Mercy tops the Observer & Eccentric's first girls' basketball ratings.

By a vote of the three Observer & Eccentric Sports Editors (Tom Baer representing Farmington and West Bloomfield, Marty Budner from Rochester and Troy, and Dennis O'Connor from Southfield and Birmingham), Mercy was picked number one over West Bloomfield.

The Mercy cagers accumulated 25 points, followed by West Bloomfield with 23. Each team had only one loss before Tuesday's games.

Bloomfield Hills Lasher (10-3 overall) finished third in the voting. Teams were awarded nine points for a first-place vote, seven for a second-place vote, five for a third-place vote, four for fourth, three for fifth, two for sixth and one for seventh.

Mercy received two first-place votes, and West Bloomfield one. Each week the O&E sports department will publish what it considers the area's best seven prep cage teams.

Mercy has a history of success. Since Larry Baker, who has never seen a girls' basketball game until he took over the Mercy program in 1975, became coach, the Marins have made it to the state finals three times.

The first two years Mercy lost to De-

troit Northeastern and Marquette in the finals. In 1977 Mercy beat a highly regarded Detroit Mumford team en route to the state championship.

Last fall Mercy was eliminated in regional competition.

Over the past three years Mercy has compiled an incredible 55-6 record, including a 12-1 mark this fall. That's a 90 percent winning average.

This year's Mercy team does not include such individual stars as Diane Dietz, Katie McNamara and K.D. Harte from past teams. The Marins of 1978 are a colorful blend of youth and depth.

Last week, in Mercy's five-point Catholic League victory over Harper Woods Regina at the Pontiac Silverdome, Baker started forwards Lisa Borchanin, Suzanne Dietz (Diane's sister) and Kelly Fortesque, and guards Lisa Morris and Denise Basford.
