

# Green scores 4 TDs in St. Mary grid romp

Sophomore Brett Green scored four touchdowns to ignite Orchard Lake St. Mary past Hamtramck St. Ladislavus 28-0 in front of a homecoming crowd at St. Mary last Sunday.

Green was a one-man show in the contest, providing the key plays in each of the four Eaglet drives. But OLSM's defense was also effective against the undermanned Lad's team, which could not penetrate no further than the OLSM 30-yard line.

The Eaglets scored once in the first half on a two-yard plunge by Green early in the opening quarter. OLSM had

its chances, racking up 11 first downs in the half, but "just couldn't punch it in," according to Eaglet coach Al Dickson.

"In the second half, we broke off some big plays," Dickson said. "We were in control most of the way. But they were much bigger than we were." The first OLSM score capped the longest drive of the game, as the Eaglets traveled 71 yards in 15 plays. Green provided the key play in the march, racing 24 yards for a first down in Lad's territory.

The Eaglets tried for the two-point

conversion after Green's touchdown run, but the pass failed, leaving them with a 5-0 lead.

The second OLSM touchdown came in the third quarter after a short Lad's punt and a good return by the Eaglets. OLSM got the ball at the Lad's 25-yard line and a 15-yard penalty against the Hamtramck school moved the Eaglets even closer to the end zone.

GREEN TOOK care of the rest himself, racing 14 yards for the score. Jim Kinville passed to Mike Landry for a two-point conversion and a 14-0 OLSM lead.

The Eaglets scored again in the third period after another good punt return that gave them field position at Lad's 45-yard line. It took only one play from there, as quarterback Don Szmek hit Green with a screen pass and sprinted through the defense for the score.

Martin Vucinjak booted the extra point for a 21-0 OLSM lead.

Green scored his final touchdown in the last period, scampering 27 yards for the score. Vucinjak again kicked the extra point to make the final, 28-0.

Lads was hurt by a lack of personnel, with only 20 players on the team

roster. Still, running back Joe Karpinski was the leading rusher in the game with 132 yards on 31 carries. Lads finished with 195 yards on the ground for the contest.

Green had 120 yards rushing on only 13 attempts. Kevin Clouse added 95 yards on 13 carries for OLSM. Szmek completed three of four passes for 65

yards and a touchdown.

The Eaglets finished with 234 yards rushing and 299 total. Lads attempted only one pass and failed to complete it, finishing with 195 total yards.

OLSM, now 2-6 for the season, hosts Detroit Servite in a game Saturday at 2:30 p.m.

## Cranbrook wins; Rice falls

Hamtramck saw a little too much of Carl Norris on Saturday.

The speedy senior tailback shredded the Hamtramck defense for 201 yards and four touchdowns as Cranbrook won, 38-8.

Norris got the Cranes started in the first quarter, capping off a 45-yard drive with a three-yard touchdown run. Al Scafuri added the extra-point.

Norris was at it again in the second quarter, plunging in from one yard out on the end of a 55-yard drive. The Cranes got a two-point conversion on a halfback pass from Stephen Park to Scott Weinberg.

Carl Aikens put Hamtramck back into the game in the third quarter with a 70-yard touchdown run. A sneak by quarterback Glen Kay for the two points made it 15-8. Suddenly Hamtramck trailed by only a touchdown.

But Norris put the game away for the Cranes two plays later, shaking loose and going 65 yards for a touchdown. Norris then ran for two points to make the score 23-8.

Cranbrook scored twice in the fourth quarter. Norris ran 12 yards for his final touchdown, and defensive end Jerome Waller returned an interception 60 yards for the Cranes final touchdown.

THE WIN was the fourth in a row for Cranbrook. The Cranes are now 5-3 overall, a big turnaround for a team that lost three of its first four games. The Cranes finished second in the Metro Conference with a 5-1 record. Their only league setback was to the eventual league champion, Detroit Lutheran West, at the first conference game of the season.
