

Walled Lake Central stuns W. Bloomfield, 10-6

A letdown was inevitable.

After losing to Bloomfield Hills Andover, 14-13, in three overtimes the previous week (allowing Andover to tie for the GOAL championship), West Bloomfield just wasn't ready for its non-

league contest with Walled Lake Central last Friday.

The lack of mental preparation proved costly for the Lakers, as they dropped a 10-6 decision. "I think after our ball game with Andover, we were ripe for an upset,"

West Bloomfield football coach Don Livedotti said.

"The kids were emotionally down. Anytime you play a team that has a losing record, the kids tend to forget about the other team's schedule. We try to teach them to respect the opponents."

Stevens took over for Curt Burnstein two games ago.

Central's first score came after West Bloomfield fumbled on its 45-yard line. Tony Norton capped the drive, diving

in from one-yard out for the touchdown late in the opening quarter.

B.J. SCOTT kicked the extra point, and added the Vikings' last three points on a 23-yard field

goal in the final quarter to give Central a 10-0 lead.

Scott's three-pointer was set up after West Bloomfield had punted to the Viking one. Two plays gained two yards, but on

third down and eight, Charlie Ginster broke through the line for a 52-yard run to get Central out of a hole.

The Central drive stalled at the Laker five, prompting Scott's field

goal.

West Bloomfield finally got on the board, as quarterback Chris Mayone sprinted in from 10 yards out for a touchdown in the final minutes.

pass failed, leaving the score at 10-6.

West Bloomfield tried an outside kick, but Central recovered. The Lakers held and got the ball back in the waning moments, but couldn't score.

Thurston earns first football victory

"There's a lesson to be learned," said Redford Thurston coach Don Riehl, celebrating the Eagles' first win of the year.

"If you keep working hard, you can be a winner." The Eagles finally found out with a thrilling 16-10 comeback win last weekend against Berkley, Friday, they'll try to make it two in a row when they travel way out on the east side to play Harper Woods Lutheran East.

"We're going to make it two," said Riehl. "That would be a great comeback for the kids."

For a long time last weekend, though, it looked like the same old story. Berkley held Thurston to just nine yards in the first half and the Bears went in for a touchdown just before halftime for a 7-0 lead.

"We did not play a good first half at all," explained Riehl. "We talked a little bit at halftime about pride. Then we

came out and played a good second half."

The fired-up Eagles marched the ball for a touchdown on their first possession of the second half. Speedster Rich Rudd returned the kickoff to his own 46. It took Thurston 11 plays to march the remaining 54. Chuck Deinzio, a sophomore, broke a key third down draw play for 22 yards to set up quarterback Paul Kostegian's five-yard

TD keeper. Thurston missed all of its extra-points.

With only 2:30 left in the game, things looked bleak for the home team when Berkley kicked a 25-yard field goal to take a 10-6 lead.

But Thurston was too hungry for a victory. Rudd returned the ensuing kickoff 77 yards, finally being downed on the Bears' eight-yard line. Seconds later, he went in for the touchdown on a one-yard plunge.

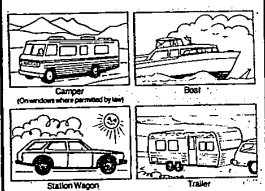
