

# Latest 'do' feather cut

Michel Kazan, the internationally known designer of hairstyles, has brought the women of America his unusual gift of elegance. This season, he's calling it "feather-it."

From long and luxuriously full to short and teasingly innocent, the "feather-it" collection has a breezy, feathered look achieved with Kazan's "pleated cut."

"The big thing right now in Paris, London and New York is the feather," said Kazan when he visited the salon

that bears his name in the Bonwit Teller Store, Troy.

"I call the style 'feather-it' because the effect is exactly like a feather. Timing is all," he said. "When the woman is so carefully dressed, the hair must be coiffed, but easy."

Kazan sees American women bundling up to prepare for an energy-conserving winter season.

"With the rest of you all bundled-up, romance and eye-catching beauty will be focused above the shoulders," he foresees. "My youthful, feminine and free hairstyles will keep every eye

riveted on women's glowing faces," he says.

"I created the bouffant hair style and I started the frizz," related Kazan. "Of both hairstyles, people said 'you are crazy no one will wear this.' But within six months the styles swept the country."

Kazan also created the Grecian boy haircut and the cap cut. Although he is flattered to see that his old creations are still popular, he wishes women would forget them and go on to something new.

"I only women would realize they must update their hairstyles. A new hairstyle will make a woman look 10 to 20 years younger. Women wear the old styles that made them successes when they were 20-years-old. They think that if they keep the same hairstyle, they will still make successes."

But that's not the case, maintains Kazan.

"With an old hairstyle, the woman looks antique and men do not like antique-looking women."

"Men say, 'did you see the beautiful blond, the beautiful redhead, the beautiful brunett?' But, did you ever hear a man say, 'did you see the beautiful gray haired woman?'"

Color is very important to hair as a most beautiful ornament with a woman's face, he said.

"Gray hair should be lightened with pale blonde highlights. Brassy colors are in bad taste; today we have to use subdued blonde colors."

Red, said Kazan, is very big for hair but it must be in the auburn shades, never red/orange.

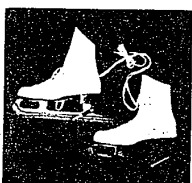
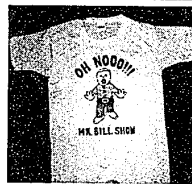
